Electors Will Not Vote on Bond Issue at Annual Meeting

The \$399,000 bond issue for the pur chase of three Junior High school sites in Grosse Pointe which the School Board had decided to place before the School District electors at the annual meeting in June, has been postponed. The postponement action was taken a last Monday evening's School Board meeting, when Charles A. Parcells, secretary, asked to have the Board reconsider its action in placing the bond issue on the ballot at the annual meeting.

Brownell, superintendent of schools, that he was ready and willing to admit a mistake having been made in rating Miss Balmer on the salary schedule at the time she came into the system, two years ago.

The other members of the School Board were quick to grasp the suggestion of Mr. Parcells and in a comparative short time, Julius Berns, vice? president, introduced a motion providing for the preparation and submission to the electors at the annual meeting of a proposition to accept suitable prorisions of the existing school code that would authorize the voting on bond issues, at the various voting precincts in the school district and also on other special matters. The motion was passed without dissent.

As result of this action, the actual execution of the proposed Junior High school program will be delayed several months as it will be necessary if the resolution is adopted at the annual meeting to subsequently call a special election for the Junior High bond issue.


