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



### 1931 License Tags May Be Obtained at Jefferson Savings

Automobile licenses may be secured from the Mack-Maryland branch of the Jefferson Savings Bank, according to an announcement made by W. Lloyd Webster, vice president and cashier. The bank has been named as agent by the Secretary of State to sell automobile licenses in Grosse Pointe.

"Don't forget to bring in the certificates of title to your car," Mr. Webster reminded those who are planning to come to the bank for their licenses. "The law does not allow us to issue a license without this certificate of title. As a branch of the Secretary of State's office, the bank will sell license plates at exactly the same prices at which they are sold at the main office of the Secretary of State."

### Rev. Arthur V. Allen To Resign Here for Post at Springfield

Rev. Arthur Vincent Allen, Pastor of the Jefferson Avenue Baptist Church since its organization in 1921, has resigned his pastorate and accepted the insistent call of the First Baptist Church of Springfield, Massachusetts, to become its minister on February 1, 1931. The church to which Rev. Allen is going is one of the outstanding churches of all New England, with a membership of more than 1700. With new and complete equipment this field, in its strategic location, presents a great challenge to intensive and extensive effort that will result in abundant fruitage.

The reading of Mr. Allen's resignation last Sunday morning was a shock to the large congregation and the severing of the happy fellowship of pastor and people of the Jefferson Avenue Baptist Church, by reason of his going, is accompanied by a sense of deepest sadness throughout every department of the church.

The history of this church under Mr. Allen's leadership has been marked by continuous spiritual and material prosperity. More than 1300 members have been received, half that number coming by baptism. A high standard of membership is maintained and the roll of the church is revised each year. The present membership is 882. The financial achievements are equally gratifying. During the past nine years the people have contributed almost \$300,000. This has been entirely through voluntary giving as the policy of this church prohibits the raising of funds by any other method. Having outgrown the older educational building, a new church auditorium was erected and dedicated three years ago, the cost of the new structure with its adjoining rooms, totaling \$165,000.00. The total property value at present is \$450,000.00. With augmented facilities it has been possible to render a greater ministry to the community. It would be difficult to find another congregation of the size and wealth of this church with a

Property owners along Lake St. Clair shore line in Village of Grosse Pointe Farms are being asked to dedicate a 120-foot right of way for the construction of a new highway through the Village to connect the west with Jefferson Avenue and on the east with the Lake Shore Drive. The photograph on the left shows the junction of the present Farms road, now 15 feet wide, with Weir Lane, at Fisher road. The photograph on the right shows the narrow Farms road where it connects at Weir Lane with the 120-foot highway, with strips of pavement in Grosse Pointe Shores. The map in center shows the present situation. The plan of Grosse Pointe Farms officials and citizens of the Wayne County Road Commission is to extend the 120-foot double-strip highway west from Weir Lane to Fisher road, a distance of one mile. A majority of Grosse Pointe Farms property owners recently passed a resolution approving the project and efforts are being made to gain support of all the owners.

### Lake Shore Drive in Farms up to Owners of Property

The 120 foot right of way along Lake St. Clair shore line in the village of Grosse Pointe Farms appears to have a certain and official in charge of the proposed waterfront drive. The work in establishing it will be completed within 18 months.

This seems assured as result of success of conferences between property owners concerned and village officials and the Wayne County Road commissioners.

For years there has been talk in the village to bring about the construction of a wide roadway to replace the narrow extension of Lake Shore Avenue known as Lake Shore Drive, which measures but 19 feet from curb to curb and which long had been inadequate to care for traffic through this section.

The present plan calls for each property owner involved to dedicate a share of the proposed right of way to the village which, in turn, will dedicate the entire strip to Wayne County, eliminating the necessity of complicated proceedings. The Board of Wayne County Road Commissioners agreed that if the country could obtain the right of way without cost, it will go ahead with the construction of the proposed highway.

To Be Mile in Length The new road, which will be approximately a mile in length, extending to the southwesterly limits of the village to Weir lane, will be a western extension of Lake Shore Drive.


