## Deter School Bond Issue Paid in Full by School Board

Mr. Charles A. Parcells, president of the Board to the Board-and must se to the that the bond issute is paid off. He stated, "The $\$ 250,000$ in bonds issued January 15,1921 , drawing interest at the rate of six per cent, which became due on January 15, 1936, were paid off with money
which was on hand for the purpose." The payment of this amount reduces the
bonded indebtedness of the school district from $\$ 3,863,000$ to $\$ 3,613,000$ and reduces the annual interest obligation bv $\$ 15,000$
