Bill Cody, whom we read so much about as an Indian fighter, was a sturdy and brave individual and on very good terms with the Indians and from facts gathered by Dr. Eastman it is evident that he was not bent on annihilating the Indians as some of these stories would have one believe. It is remarkable how the story of Bill Cody's life was so distorted as to picture one so friendly as a destroyer of those he held in high regard.

At the present time Dr. Eastman is completing a book titled "The Fall of the Algonquins," in which he reveals a hitherto unknown historical fact portraying the betrayal of Chief Pontiac by Katherine, a member of his tribe. These facts have been handed down from generation to generation by members of the tribe, details of which Dr. Eastman has in his possession at this time.

This book will be published shortly as well as a book of memoirs which is nearing completion.

Noted Organ Virtuoso Coming

Gatty Sellars, the world's great descriptive organist composer, whose films, records, compositions, have gone all over the world, comes in person to the organ at St. Paul's Cathedral, Woodward at Hancock, on Monday, February 1, when his performance will prove a revelation in the handling of "The King of Instruments" from a descriptive standpoint. Those

who have seen and heard the reproduction of such compositions on the screen, on the air, and on the records, will doubtless assemble in large numbers to hear the composer's actual performance. Such compositions have had their first hearing by such bands as the Royal Marines, before Royalty, also H. M. Grenadier and Coldstream Guards' Bands.

Mr. Sellars is the solo organist for the World's Greatest National Band Festival at the Crystal Palace, where he is heard by an audience of fifty thousand and is the composer of this year's "test piece" for one of the great English Band contests. In over two thousand five hundred recitals in seven years in Europe, North and South America, he has appeared on more organs than any living organist, attracting the largest audiences in the history of most of the cities visited, for an organ recital.

In South America nine appearances were made in the St. John's Pro-Cathedral, Buenos Aires; even then hundreds were unable to gain admission, a remarkable achievement for a single artist.

Programs are usually played entirely from memory, and an extemporization given on any theme requested.

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New Tricks with Familiar Foods

New dishes are always stimulating, but new tricks with everyday foods give one a real feeling of accomplishment.

If you feel that urge for something different, butter your special baking dish and try these receipts.

Escalloped Elbow Macaroni with Spinach and Cheese 2 pounds fresh spinach 2 tablespoons lemon juice 2 tablespoons pimento 1 1/2 cups medium white sauce 1/2 package elbow macaroni, cooked 3 hard cooked eggs 1 cup grated cheese 1 cup bread crumbs Wash spinach carefully, cook, drain and chop fine. Add lemon juice and chopped pimento to spinach. Mix with white sauce. Place macaroni in buttered baking dish. Slice eggs and place on macaroni. Pile on spinach mixture and cover with grated cheese. Top with bread crumbs and bake in moderate oven (350°F) for twenty minutes. Serves six.

If you are making the most of the oyster season, try a casserole dish of Deviled Oysters with Noodles 2 dozen oysters 1 tablespoon butter 2 tablespoons green peppers 1 cup cream Salt and pepper 1/2 package noodles, cooked. Chop oysters. Melt butter in a saucepan. Add oysters, green pepper, cream seasoning to taste, and noodles. Mix thoroughly. Place in greased baking dish. Bake in moderate oven for fifteen minutes. Serves six.
