### Boy Scout Activities

Membership figures of the local Boy Scout Council are consistently increasing each month and total membership at the present time shows a large increase over a year ago. Total Scout membership as of June 30 in 419 Scout Troops and 28 Cub Packs is 12,688 Scouts and 979 Cubs or a total of 13,667 registered boys. In addition to the boy membership, there are 3,072 leaders or a grand total of 16,739 registered boys and leaders in the Detroit Area Council as of the end of June. This is a net gain of 3,413 members over the 13,326 of a year ago. In a recent bulletin sent to all Scouts and leaders. The Council suggested a number of activities for summer programming. Many of the Detroit Schools are available as summer meeting places for Troops and many of the School Pools have been scheduled (through the cooperation of the Department of Recreation) for Scout Swimming. ### AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE Hawkers and Peddlers

#### THE CITY OF GROSSE POINTE ORDAINS:

Section 1. For the purposes of this ordinance hawkers or peddlers shall include those who offer for sale or for advertising purposes any goods, wares, merchandise, refreshments or other kinds of property upon the streets, sidewalks, public ways, public property, and between the streets and sidewalks in the City of Grosse Pointe, whether on foot or in or upon a vehicle.

Section 2. No person, firm or corporation shall engage in any way in the business of hawking or peddling as herein defined excepting under a license provided for in this ordinance.

Section 3. Every applicant for a license must file with the City Clerk upon a form prepared by the Clerk a sworn application giving the name and address of the applicant, the class of license for which he is applying, the length of time during which he proposes to continue such business in the City of Grosse Pointe, and, if the applicant expects to use a vehicle in such business in the City of Grosse Pointe, a description of the same with the license number or other means of identification of such vehicle. The applicant in such application agree that while in the City of Grosse Pointe for the purpose of making sales or for advertising purposes he will not call his wares, or use any bell or other noise contrivance to attract attention to the sale of his wares or park or stop his vehicle or himself remain in any one place excepting when actually consummating a sale or in compliance with the traffic regulations or in case of emergency.

Section 4. The Clerk shall pass upon all such applications. No application shall be approved unless the applicant agrees to comply with all ordinances of the City of Grosse Pointe, agrees to conduct his business in a business-like way, and agrees to comply with the matters set forth in his application and there is attached to such application the license fee required herein.

Section 5. The license shall be issued by the City Clerk, who shall keep a complete record in his office of each license issued and pay the license fee forthwith into the City treasury.

Section 6. A license may not be assigned.

Section 7. The license fee to be charged by the City shall be as follows: \$3 per day for each individual hawking or peddling on foot. \$5 per day for each individual hawk-

ing or peddling from any vehicle of any kind. \$75 per year for each individual hawking or peddling on foot. \$150 per year for each individual hawking or peddling from any vehicle of any kind.

Section 8. Hawkers or peddlers so licensed when engaged in such business must exhibit such license at the request of any citizen.

Section 9. A license may be revoked by the Clerk for a violation of any law or ordinance or the violation of any of the matters set forth in the application or for any undesirable business practice. The applicant may appeal to the Council from such revocation by filing a written request for an appeal with the Clerk. The Clerk shall thereupon furnish the applicant at the address stated in the application, by mail or otherwise, with a written statement of the reason or reasons for the revocation and the date of the next Council meeting at which he may be heard, which meeting shall be at least five days after the serving of such notice. The matter shall be duly heard by the Council and if it finds the licensee guilty, the revocation shall stand, otherwise it shall be reversed.

Section 10. This ordinance shall not be interpreted as allowing hawking or peddling in any public park in the City of Grosse Pointe.

Section 11. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction be punished by a fine not to exceed \$100.00 and costs or by imprisonment not exceeding 60 days or both.

Section 12. This ordinance shall not in any way affect an ordinance entitled "Prohibiting entering the premises of another" adopted December 27, 1933, nor an ordinance entitled "Prohibiting solicitors, agents, peddlers, etc." effective June 31, 1934.

This ordinance shall be effective 10 days after the publication thereof.
