Res. 408) which provides for national referendum before conscription for foreign wars. This move is finding unanimous and everincreasing approval of organizations and deep-thinking individuals who wish to see America maintain its traditional policy of peace and freedom from entangling alliances and intrigue. The sinister innuendoes emanating from the national capitol as to partisanship; feeling and support of the belligerants in the present European conflict, is creating a hatred and unneutral feeling that must be counteracted if the United States of America is to be assured of staying out of the war. Public Expenditure Survey Spokesman Speaks Of Economy

You may be interested in the latest statement of the State auditor general, in which he says that Wayne County must wait for one-half of its share of the gasoline tax money. "The financing of this State is run

with childish disregard for sound financial policies," it was stated. "In 1939 our spending amounted to

247 million dollars. In 1923, with about the same population, it amounted to only 66 million. With only 11 million dollars on hand, we owe 20 million, or almost. one-third of the entire cost of State government in 1923!

"To call a spade a spade, the State is spending money that belongs to Wayne, County. The citizen cannot spend his neighbor's money in the hope of paying it back. The same rules of etiquette and honesty should apply to the financial manipulations of our 'trusted public servants'.

"Padded payrolls are the answer to part of this spending spree, which makes the State, always in the redand 'begging for more'. Some people are maintaining entirely too elaborate a campaign army at the public expense. The number of State employees has gone up more than 25 per cent since 1935.




