Supervisor's Session Ends in Turmoil

Strongarm and unethical tactics became evident at the session of the County Board of Supervisors held Thursday, April 11, resulting in a questionable adjournment of the board until the next sitting day, which is interpreted to be by many as the June session.

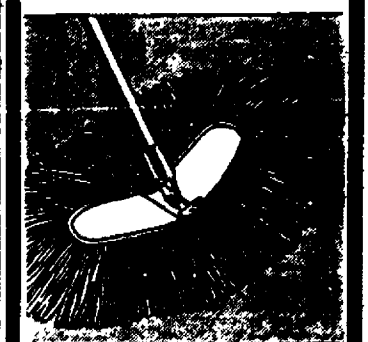
All of this occurred during the balloting for the appointment of a road commissioner, which balloting was not completed before the turmoil was started. The board, at a previous session, had voted to proceed with the appointment on a closed ballot, after moving to overrule the chair on an open ballot. The candidates for the appointment are John F. Breining, incumbent and chairman of the Board of County Road Commissioners and Philip Neudeck, an attorney.

One ballot was taken Tuesday, which resulted in Breining receiving 74 votes as against Neudeck's 72, three less than the majority required for the appointment. After Tuesday's adjournment the board re-convened on Wednesday and took two ballots, the second one showing Breining in the lead, 75 to 71, after which the board adjourned until Thursday. During the course of the balloting on Thursday, after all the votes had been cast and the count completed, Supervisor Doyle of Dearborn, supporting the Neudeck forces, protested the closed ballot and asked for a legal opinion on the point. Other supervisors expressed their opinion on placing this matter before the board and the chair refused to recognize

numerous supervisors who asked to be heard on the question. During the course of the argument, which almost approached rowdiness, there was a motion to adjourn, which was apparently voted down by an overwhelming majority. In spite of this, the chairman, Harry I. Dingman, refused to accept this vote and called for another vote which was again overwhelmingly against adjournment. At least one supervisor asked for a split vote on the motion to adjourn, which the chairman refused to recognize and ruled that the session was adjourned without setting the date to which it has been adjourned, and left the rostrum with at least three supervisors on the floor appealing from the ruling.

There was then a mad rush for the door by the supporters of the adjournment motion, and although some of the more level-headed supervisors attempted to keep the supervisors in attendance until there was a legal adjournment, they were unsuccessful, due to the Neudeck supporters. This certainly indicates an attitude of poor sportsmanship on the part of a "Detroit group," bent on taking over

a county department, which such tactics become evident at a formal session of the county's legislative body.

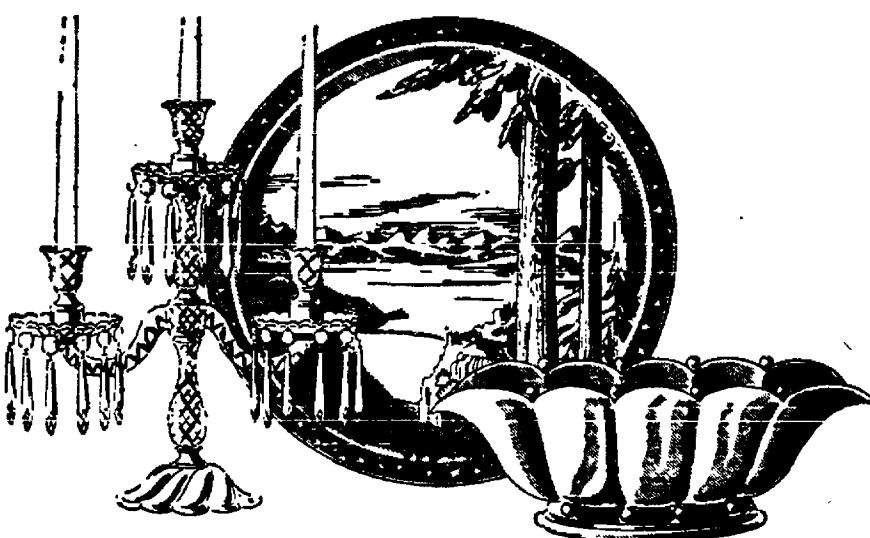
Local Student Flyer Attends Convention in Washington, D. C.
