Points and Pointers

The open-air theater of yesterday, where patrons sat on hard wooden seats, fought insects, and hoped it wouldn't rain, seems to be no more. In its place has come a new type of outdoor theater—the Drive-In Theatre—where patrons now lounge comfortably in their own cars, to watch their favorite performers. What ever insects there might be at the Eastside Drive-In Theatre, hastily take refuge when they get a taste of the fumes from several hundred autos. Rain—let it rain, for modern science has devised means to enable the patron of the auto theater to continue to see and hear his pictures. Major reason for the Eastside Drive-In's ability to operate during the rain is the powerful light projected onto the screen. With adjustable sound reproduction for the individual speakers, the theater simply increases the volume of the sound when it becomes necessary to close car windows because of rain. Diligent search has failed to unearth one old fashioned "airdome" anywhere in the United States. Even in St. Louis, where once they flourished, finally denied them patronage.

The Eastside Drive-In Theatre seems not to have killed the airdome, for it died in most locations before the Drive-In arrived. In many locations it met its demise even before sound and air-conditioning.

The facts seem, according to fairly unanimous opinion of old timers in show business, that the airdome was never too successful, requiring a sit duplicated equipment and seating. And so in the swift current of events in
