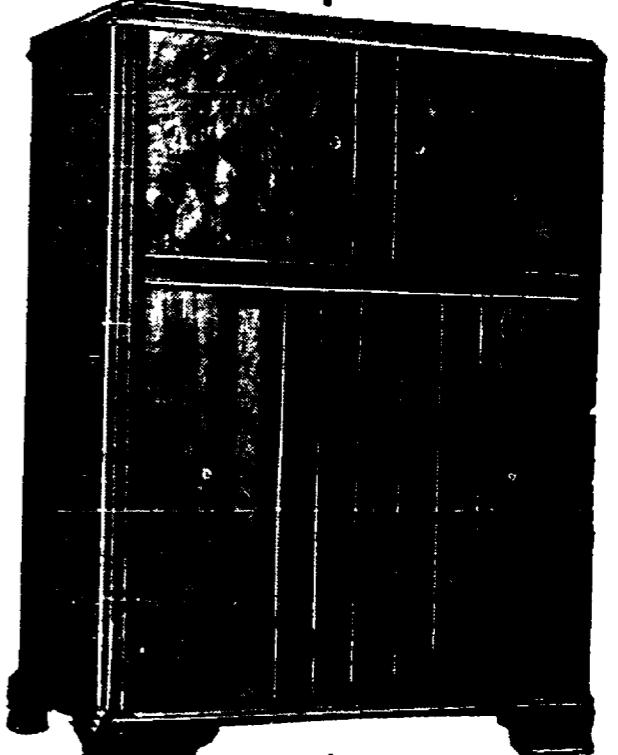

Lecture Series Starts Monday, October 7

"Contemporary Literature and Drama," a series of eight monthly lectures to be given this season at the Pierce Junior High School by Olive Deane Hornel, might be subtitled "World Trends as Reflected in the Season's Books and Plays," according to the lecturer. The course should not be classed as "literary" in the narrow meaning of the word, for it shows the arts of literature and drama as presenting basic truths about our current problems where mere factual reporting must necessarily touch upon them superficially in comparison.

The series, which is being sponsored by the University of Michigan Alumni Club of Grosse Pointe, is keyed to the most vital trends of the time, both national and international. Its authenticity and sound scholarship are guaranteed by its university backing. Its timeliness of content and freshness of approach are sustained by the full co-operation of both producers and publishers—and it is the only book and play course to have such three-fold co-operation. Because of it, Miss Hornel last season was enabled to give informative accounts of important material even before press accounts were available, most notably of Herman Raushning's book, "The Voice of Destruction," now a best-seller, and the new Robert Sherwood play, "There Shall Be No Night."

The opening lecture in this season's series, which will be given at 8 o'clock, Monday evening, October 7, is "Modern Makers of Books." A brief sketch of outstanding publishers and how they find their authors will be given and in each case Miss Hornel will cite the one or two books which are each publisher's most noteworthy contribution. An interesting exhibit has been planned for this lecture, showing the successive stages in the evolution of a book from author's manuscript to bound volume.
