Christmas Carols

Each holiday season the familiar words of the tuneful Christmas Carol ring out all over the country. The origin of these songs is both interesting and colorful. While some of them were composed here in America, others were written and set to music in other parts of the world. Below, with illustrations, and a brief history of origin are presented some of the better known of these songs.



O little town of Bethlehem,
How still we see thee lie;
Above thy deep and dreamless sleep
The silent stars go by...

These words were written in 1868 by Phillips Brooks, young rector of Philadelphia, after a visit to Palestine. His church organist, Lewis Redner, wrote the melody. It came to him "in a dream" on Christmas Eve.



I heard the bells on Christmas Day
Their old familiar carols play,
And wild and sweet the words repeat
Of peace on earth, good will to men

When Henry Wadsworth Longfellow wrote the words to this song the United States was experiencing its second year of the Civil war. The words, "peace on earth," gave expression to the hope of millions.



It came upon the midnight clear,
That glorious song of old—
From angels bending near the earth,
To touch their harps of gold.

Here is another beloved carol which was composed in America. The words were written in December, 1849, by Rev. Edmund Sears. It was sung to an old hymn-tune until its present melody was composed by Richard Willis in 1851.



O come, all ye faithful
Joyful and triumphant,
O come ye,
O come ye to Bethlehem.

Origin of this hymn is controversial. When introduced in England about 1800 it was known as the "Portuguese Hymn." Its lines do not rhyme because they were translated from the Latin.



The first Noel the angels did say
Was to certain poor shepherds in fields
as they lay,
In fields where they lay keeping their sheep
On a cold winter's night that was so deep.

This is a true folk-song, claimed by both France and England. According to tradition, the verses are sung by the shepherds and the refrain by the angels.

Santa's Costume

Here is an inexpensive way to make Santa's costume. Make the knee-length coat of an old night shirt cut down and dyed red, but if this is too much work, use a red mackinaw. Border it with priceless ermine consisting of white cotton flannel spotted at the proper intervals with ink or black shoe polish. Santa should wear red golf stockings and heavy boots, plus a stocking cap and bright mittens. Put a scarf about his neck. When he is done there is no need of a mask; his own mother would not know him under those beaming eyebrows.

Enliven Appearance Of Christmas Tree

Before pulling out the old box of ornaments used for trimming the Christmas tree for the past several years, it is a good idea to plan some other decoration which will make the tree different than it ever was before. An occasional change from the old familiar design will do much to brighten up the room.

One novel arrangement is to imitate the snow-draped trees of the forest as closely as possible. Trim the tree all in white with popcorn necklaces, tissue paper snow balls, white glass ornaments and frosted white lights. The effectiveness of this color will be increased if green wreaths with red berries are used about the room.

A graceful pine tree trimmed lavishly all in gold ornaments has a fine formal grandeur about it and is particularly distinguished in certain rooms. In contrast to this a tree trimmed entirely with red and white lights and red and white striped candy canes is very young and informal in heart.

Little pleated paper fans made of Christmas wrapping paper help to "fill" a big tree inexpensively if glass balls and other ornaments are lacking. It is also interesting to add local interest by hanging articles found in the vicinity, such as an unusual sea shell, or huge pine cones, or curious burrs and pods which are gilded to improve their appearance.

Miniature trees are attractive, too, especially when they're spangled with beads and shiny jewelry from the five and ten.

Decorate Yule Tree To Fit Your Taste

Before trimming your Christmas tree this December, study the following ideas and decide which yours will be. The six Christmas trees described below, are trimmed in amazingly new and different ways.

The "Coronado" is typically southwestern. A tree trimmed in cowboys and cactus... Indian relics and dazzling yellow lights.

"Colonial" is early American in every detail, trimmed with miniature wooden churns, log cabins, candle sticks, Indians, turkeys and colonial dolls. Green colored lights and silver tinsel complete the color interest.

The "Student" does everything but say "Rah, rah." Various colored lights shine on gaudy trimmings and erasures, crayons, pencils and slates for classroom touch.

The "Maritime" is nautically trimmed with clipperships, anchors, sloops and buoys. Blue lights gleam through clouds of angel hair.

"Victorian" is brilliant with white lights and tinsel branches and is decorated all over with unique ornaments of every shape, size and color.

The "Canine" is an amusing idea to please the canine member of the family. Decorated with bones, dog toys, fire plugs, dog biscuits, and vari-colored lights... a real "fun" tree.

Local Draft Board Doubles Output Of Questionnaires

Spurred by the declaration of war, local draft board 57 is sending out questionnaires in twice the numbers than before hostilities began, draft officials said this week.

Before the outbreak of war, questionnaires mailed out averaged 50 a week. The number has now been boosted to between 75 and 100 a week.

Only 284 questionnaires remain to be sent to local men which should exhaust the local list in about three weeks.

Four more men from this area were classified as 1-A last Friday and are on call for service with the army. These men are: Charles D. Dilloway, 23, of 1235 Lakepointe; Wesley L. Mueller, 21, of 7333 Kercheval, Detroit; Harry F. Wythe, 21, of 813 Beaconsfield, and William A. Hoose, 21, of 441 Moran road.

Feeling the Christmas Spirit

During the Christmas season one sometimes hears the plaintive question, "How can I feel and enter into the Christmas spirit when my own affairs and the lives of others seem so troubled?"

Sincere self-searching often uncovers the errors which claim to hinder joyous participation in this happy, holy season. The individual may be deploring his inability to give generously. Memories of other Christmas seasons, which were happy and gay before family ties were broken, may rise to oppress a lonely one. Others may be so concerned about persons and things that Christmas has for them no sacred significance. The earnest Christian needs to ask himself: "Why is this?"

Is happiness at Christmas time dependent upon a material sense of things? Are human modes of giving and receiving so important as to affect true joy?

The longing to feel and fulfill the true spirit of Christmas is surely blessed by our heavenly Father. The quiet contemplation of the spiritual episodes which preceded and followed the first Christmas Day, lifts thought above an apathetic endurance of human necessities. Nothing can dim the spiritual beauty and power of the Scriptural narrative of the nativity, as given in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. Again and again, the Christian student is impressed by the boundless joy which was felt by those whose spiritual sense discerned the fulfillment of divine prophecy in this great event.

The Wisemen, who saw and followed the star in the east, "rejoiced with exceeding great joy" (Matthew 2:10). And when they found the infant Jesus they fell at his feet, and offered him precious gifts. Watchful shepherds, who were tending their flocks on the Judean countryside, heard the angel message of "good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people" (Luke 2:10). Heavenly intuition led them to Bethlehem, where they found the babe lying in a manger. Many of the villagers listened with awe while the shepherds related the wonderful message which had come to them that night. Then these simple, kindly men returned to their sheep tending "glorifying and praising God" (2:20). Later, Simon, a spiritually-minded man in Jerusalem, took the child Jesus in his arms, and blessed God

for the light and glory which had come into the world. . . .

On page 332 of "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," Mary Baker Eddy writes, "Christ is the true idea voicing good, the divine message from God to men speaking to the human consciousness."

Troubles disappear when the true spirit of Christmas is understood, felt, and loved. Abundant health, activity, happiness, and affection are the natural co-comitants of the right and understanding of God and ever-present Christ, Truth. . . .

The real man, who is God's offspring, His likeness, is spiritual, perfect, eternal. God's thoughts, or ideas, are imbued with His power and goodness. They are pure, life-giving, and ennobling. Scouts Take Part In First Aid Meets

Simple Decorations Provide Originality To Christmas Table

To the homemaker who is worried about the expense of Christmas decorations, here are a few new and inexpensive ways of adding originality to the Christmas table:

Try red or blue cellophane over a white table cloth. Cellophane will not discolor the cloth as will some colored papers.

Paste various-sized stars to the white cloth. Or, paste cutouts of Santa, reindeer, candies, holly sprays, etc.

Use a ribbon of gold or silver paper down the center of the table.

'Cookie Tree' Is Easy to Make

A Christmas tree that looks good enough to eat, and really is, is the novel cookie Christmas tree. It's an easy tree to make, and as a table centerpiece it is sure to delight the youngsters, as well as the most sophisticated holiday guests.

Necessary equipment includes a wooden stick 9 1/2 inches tall, 3/4 inch in diameter, one end sharpened to a point; one round wooden base, 8 inches in diameter, with a 1/2-inch hole in the center; one 12-inch circle of colored transparent paper; nine cardboard patterns of six-point stars, ranging in size from 10 inches to 2 inches in diameter, with a difference of one inch between sizes, and one round cookie cutter, 1 1/2 inches in diameter.

The recipe for the cookies is as follows:

1 cup shortening	3 tps. ginger
1 cup sugar	3 tps. cinnamon
1 cup molasses	Candied cherries
1 cup all-bran	Silver candies
4 cups flour	Green-colored sugar
3 tps. soda	Almond halves
1/2 tsp. salt	

Blend shortening and sugar thoroughly, add molasses and all-bran and mix well. Sift flour, soda, salt, ginger and cinnamon together and work into creamed mixture a small amount at a time. Mix well and easy tree to make, and as a table centerpiece it is sure to delight the youngsters, as well as the most sophisticated holiday guests.

Roll dough on a well-greased baking sheet to one-fourth inch thickness. Place patterns on dough and cut out stars. Brush with egg whites. Cut out 16 small round cookies—do not decorate these. Decorate stars with almonds, candied cherries or silver candies. Sprinkle with green sugar. Cut small hole in center of each cookie to fit over standard. (This may be done after baking while cookie is hot.) Bake in moderate oven, 350 to 375 degrees F. for 15 minutes, or until done.

To assemble the tree place stick, pointed end up, in hole of base to make standard. Place transparent paper over standard so that it lies flat on base. Pile cookie stars on standard, starting with the largest size star at the bottom. Use one or two of the small round cookies between the stars to separate them.

Smaller trees may be made from smaller stars by using skewers stuck into halves of apples or round pieces of baked cookie dough for standards.
