

## **Need for Continuing** of Postal Facilities Seen by Committee

At least thirteen thousand persons have made use of the so-called "Christmas" post office for Grosse Pointe residents at 17140 Maumee from Friday, Dec. 11 through Monday, Dec. 21, inclusive. This alone shows the popularity and the necessity of having postal facilities available in this area, but the fact that \$8,000 worth of stamps were sold for letters and parcel post packages further substantiates this fact.

The amount of mail dispatched during the above-mentioned days resulted in 59 pouches of first class mail; 584 sacks of parcel post packages; and 200 outsize packages. There were 3,500 parcels insured. In part, the above figures are approximate, although the computation for Dec. 11 through the 19th,
