Job Opportunities for Men and Women Great in Industry

Opportunities for women loom large in a list of job openings, available through offices of the United States Employment Service, which was announced today by M. A. Clark, district director of the way manpower commission.

At least fifty women, Clark reports, are needed for sub-assembly work on aircraft parts. No experience is required, but to qualify applicants must be between 18 and 35 years of age and must weigh not more than 135 pounds.

A Detroit aircraft plant offers to train a number of women to do aircraft riveting and to pay them while learning.

Clark also announced immediate openings for a number of men and women who have completed courses in inspection techniques. They will be employed as inspectors of anti-aircraft gun parts. The only requirements are intelligence and ability to read blueprints and micrometers.

"It is encouraging to have employers ask for trainees," said Clark. "It indicates that the public schools offering these training courses are doing a thorough job."

Workers not now engaged at their highest skill in essential jobs are urged to apply at 14421 E. Jefferson avenue. Only persons eligible for employment under the war manpower commission employment stabilization plan will be considered.
