The first period will be from March 1 to March 31 and 48 points for each person, regardless of age, has been allotted. Sales of processed foods included in the ration order will be frozen Feb. 21 at 12:01 a.m. Sales of the rationed foods will start March 1, 12:01 a.m., and after that time points must be surrendered for the purchase of rationed foods.

OPA pointed out that the stamps to be removed from the No. 2 book for excess inventories is not to be considered as a penalty nor are the declarers regarded as hoarders. This deduction method is used, OPA explained only to get as fair a distribution of commercially packed foods as possible.

Stamps will be tailored from the books uniformly and in no case will any book be tailored more than one-half the points allotted for a month's ration period.

signals are received in one location, fire signals in another, and the street and public works departments are in a third. In Grosse Pointe, on the other hand, a flash from the control center is relayed to the police departments in each zone, and each police department is housed in the same building, or next door to, the fire department and public works headquarters.

Mr. Elworthy asked that every air raid warden in the Grosse Pointe area learn the headquarters, or report center, at which he will receive orders in case of an alert. This is one of the matters which will be stressed at the zone and district meetings of wardens.

Mr. Sutton and Mr. Gillett presented each person with copies of forms which must be filled out by March 1 concerning meetings held in zones and districts. Miss Booth will check each monthly report, and wardens will be required to catch up on courses of instruction in which they are deficient.

the family could register for the entire family unit, but possession of a war ration book one, now used for sugar, coffee and shoes, is required in order to obtain the new book.

The applicant must also fill out a declaration of inventory form, OPA form R-1301, stating the number of excess containers of processed foods which the household possesses. All applicants must submit an inventory whether they have any foods to declare or not. If the applicant has no foods in storage he states "none."

The allowable inventory. OPA said, is five cans a person. If there are four persons in the household
