### Reasons to Vote 'No' on Home Rule

EDITOR'S NOTE: The following reasons are part of a series of 16 reasons to vote "No" on the proposed Wayne county home rule amendment to the state constitution, and were prepared by hte committee for representative government, opposing the adoption of the home rule amendment. They are submitted in the interest of interpreting the proposed amendment. It is to be remembered that the Grosse Pointe township board is unanimously recommending the rejection of the proposal.

3. It is undemocratic because it discriminates between large and small units of government. Detroit alone would retain its identity and be allowed up to two-thirds of the representation on the governing body, while the remainder of the county would be arbitrarily divided into representative districts without regard for township of city lines.

4. It destroys the American system of constitutional government. The amendment would nullify the Michigan constitution in Wayne county and withdraw its protection from the citizens and the local units of government, for i provides, "Notwithstanding any other provision of this constitution, the government of Wayne county may be or ganized under a charter which shall provide for." The enu meration, of what the charter may "provide for," is so broad that practically any and all of the inalienable rights and immunities guaranteed by the constitution could be disregarded and destroyed. The prime purpose of a constitution under our American system is to guarantee certain basic and fundamental rights to all citizens and all local units of government, both large and small. This protection is essential to the very existence of local government, le alone its right to "home rule." Without it, all minorities and small governmental units would fall easy prey to the tyranny of any local or temporary majority.


### WHO'S KIDDING WHO, NOW?

BANISHING JITTERBUGS ... Jitterbugs may claim the center of attention on the dance floor, but an Edison power house is no place for large, heavy equipment to start doing a jig. When a huge fan mounted a hundred feet above the ground, or a turbo-generator weighing 500 tons, turns jitterbug, something has to damage to the equipment or the building and cause interruptions to service. So one of our engineers goes to work with a remarkable vibration-meter, locates the source of the trouble and measures the amount of vibration. Then he corrects the condition by balancing the equipment or isolating it from the building structure by suitable means.



MEAT-POINT STRETCHER . . . Our Home Service Department offers this modern version of an old Scotch recipe. It is easy on the ration book:

Supper Pie

4 thsp. minced onion 1 thep, butter 1 lb. ground beef

1 can condensed tomato soup Pie pastry for two-crust pie

Cook onions in butter until soft. Add ground beef and cook until barely brown; then add condensed tomato soup. Sprinkle with salt and pepper and mix well. Line a 9-inch pie plate with short pastry, rolled 1/8-inch thick. Moisten edges of crust with cold water. Fill pie shell with meat mixture. Prick top crust and place over pie, brush with melted butter and bake in moderate oven, 375 F., for one hour, or bake in a hot oven, 450 F., for 15 minutes, and then decrease heat to 350 F. and bake 15 minutes



SLIP COVERS FOR LAMP SHADES . . . If you have a soiled lamp shade and cannot obtain a new shade, try making a "slip cover" using patterned paper of a light color, or cotton cloth (gingham, percale, chambray). Lay the material on the lamp shade, and mark the shape to be cut out. Then sew or paste the edges together and finish with a simple edging or trimming. Slip the new shade over the old shade.



DUST STEALS LIGHT . . . Dust and dirt collecting on lamp bulbs, reflector bowls and fixtures will often absorb as much as 50 per cent of the light. To get all the light you pay for, clean lamp bulbs and fixtures frequently, also floor and table lamps. Wipe lamp bulbs and bowls with a damp cloth, and be sure lamp bulbs are dry before screwing back in socket. A soft brush can be used for dusting lamp shades.

#### **ADDRESS**

Clearly and legibly and correctly address your parcel. Print address if possible with something which will not mar, run or fade. Put address and return on inside as well as outside, in case of package being torn.

#### LABEL

Don't forget to mark your package "Christmas Gift Package."






