## Ford Home Burglarized

The haul includes six pieces of jewelry valued at \$12,000; \$200 in cash and a number of smaller pieces of jewelry.

### Reasons to Vote 'No' on Home Rule

EDITOR'S NOTE: The following reasons are part of series of 16 reasons to vote "No" on the proposed Ways county home rule amendment to the state constitution, as were prepared by the committee for representative govern ment, opposing the adoption of the home rule amendmen They are submitted in the interest of interpreting the pre posed amendment. It is to be remembered that the Gross Pointe township board is unanimously recommending the rejection of the proposal.

15. It ignores practical experience. The amendment bars anyone with practical experience in county govern ment from the charter commission. Improvement in go ernment is best effected by evolution rather than revol tion. This amendment ignores all of the findings of 10 years experience with the present system of government and starts anew with a complete system founded only d

16. It is not home rule. All of the basic frame work the proposed county charter is included by way of manda tory provisions in the amendment. Thus the people Wayne county could neither choose the type of gover ment they desired nor change it without again amending the constitution. As examples, it requires a chief executiv non-partisan elections, a system of civil service, etc. order to have home rule, the people of Wayne county mu have the right to accept or reject all of these factors.
