

Bomber Pilot

From Burma Front. - The defeat of the Japanese ground forces in Burma and their expulsion from the Imphal Plain by the 14th Army was materially assisted by a squadron of USAAF B-25's (Mitchells) of the third tactical air force, Eastern Air Command, who flew in thousands of pounds of ammunition.

Colonel McCarten evaded the first flight without incident, but a plane from the second flight set one of his engines on fire. Despite this handicap, Colonel McCarten was able to fly the Mitchell back to its home base, where he crash-landed without injury to the crew.
