Quite by accident, your navy has created a new "home front" weapon, supplied its users with ammunition and is training a new generation of sharpshooters. And the whole thing results from an economy move.

Incidentally, this will also clear up the mystery of "Where did all the bean shooters come from?"

Recently the navy found it had no use for 6,500 11-inch lengths of flexible tubular insulation on its hands. So the stuff was turned over to the Killed in Japanese material redistribution and disposal office in Detroit, which offered the Bombing of Leyte tubes for sale.

The tubes, however, had no takers until a navy officer had an inspiration. He sold the lot to a novelty dealer for bean shooters. Superior bean shooters, too, that could shoot around a corner or be folded quickly into a pocket to thwart enemy reconnaissance.

On the basis of an estimated annual payroll of \$180,000, the approximate cost will be \$10,671; this includes the police and fire pension as well as the remaining municipal emplovees. The plan will cost more for the time being because of the ages and service records of the employees. It is expected to fluctuate between six and ten thousand dollars in the near future.

Provision has been made that at no time can the cost exceed seven

per cent of the payroll.
