The explanation is not satisfactory, nor apparently too acmarate in several respects, to-wit:

1. Reference is made to annual and anticipated expense "extensions," meaning extension of water main service. The Review is advised that all needed water mains are laid and have been laid for years and we are reminded that the Village sertain fixed boundaries and could hardly be looking towand further expansion.

2. A 17% loss in the amount of water purchased from Detroit and the actual metered to customers has heretofore een paid from the general fund of the Village. Included in this oss, of course, we must naturally deduct the water used in the Village buildings, fire department and fire hydrants. It would hardly seem consistent with good business practices to make the utility pay the load on an expense which is a general biligation of the Village and as such should be spread on the ax rolls, instead of assumed by large water consumers in inreasing proportions.

3. According to Communique No. 2, total direct expense eperating the water department in 1943-44 was \$67,489.33. er the efficient direction of Mr. Lane, it is personally esnated by him that it will be \$71,500.00 for 1944-45, or an inmed cost of \$4,000.
