Establish Hearing Aid Center Here

A hearing aid center where those who are hard of hearing can test various types of hearing aids and determine which will best suit their particular needs, has been established by the Detroit League for the Handicapped, Mrs. Nelson W. McCormick, director of this Community Fund agency, announced this week.

There are six such centers already established in large cities throughout the United States and a number of others being started. The league's center will be the first of its kind in Detroit.

Mrs. Ethel S. Moros, who is in charge of the hearing aid center, which is in the Krolik building, 316 East Jefferson, has patterned it after the war department's Aural Rehabilitation Center for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing at Doshon General Hospital, Butler, Pa.

The services, which are free, include audiometric tests to determine the type and extent of hearing deficiency, listening hours during which persons can test and become accustomed to hearing aids by listening to special phonograph recordings of the sounds heard in a normal day.

LIEUT. FREDERICK C. FORD, JR., 26, USNR, son of Mr. and Mrs. F. C. 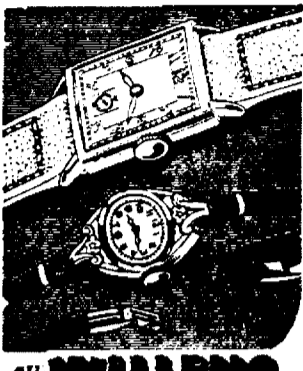
Naval Air Gunners' School Jacksonville, Fla.

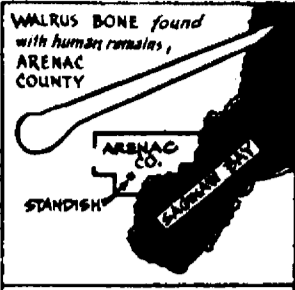

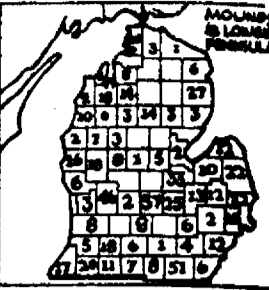

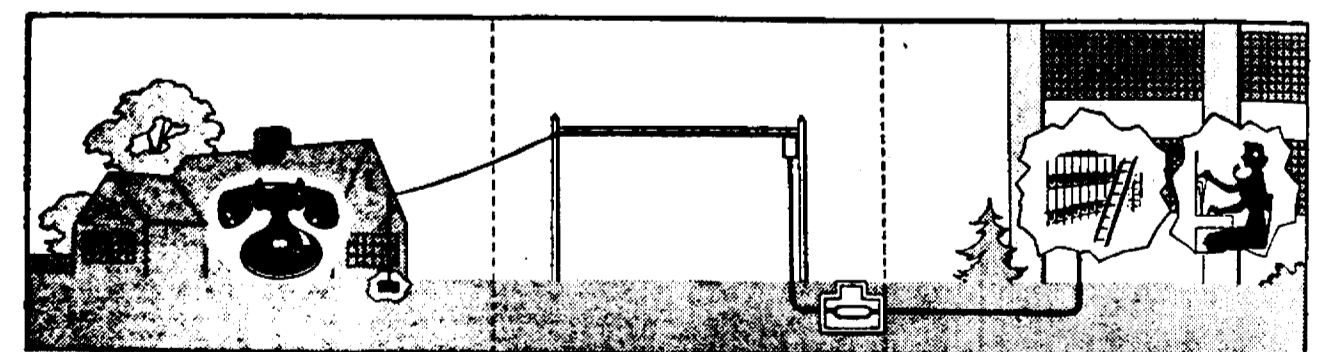

Stamp Pointers AND Pointers' Stamps
 by WARD H. ALKEMA

Many and varied are the ways of collecting United States stamps. Some collect mint or unused blocks of four and a single of each stamp. Others want plate blocks of four, that is a block of four stamps with plate number on the outside edge. The plate numbers of the new army stamp are 23325 and 23327.

Quite a few collectors buy a full sheet of each stamp. This is a more expensive way of collecting but it is like money in the bank — only more so. One does not think of a hobby purely as an investment but with postage stamps this is truly so. For example, sheets of the Korea stamp which were issued on Nov. 2, 1944 and cost \$2.50 each, now sell for \$7. Of course the main purpose of a collection is not to make money but it is nice to know your stamps are worth much more than you paid for them when you do wish to sell. As one Detroit dealer so aptly puts it, "Buy stamps for your present pleasure and future profit."

My own favorite way of collecting United States stamps is town cancellations centered nicely on the stamp and also used blocks of four stamps. These do not cost as much as mint stamps but are much harder to get.

The post office department has a Philatelic Agency in Washington to facilitate the purchase of postage stamps by mail. The year ending June 30, the agency sold \$2,489,000. At the present time they have on hand:

Three-cent Susan B. Anthony; 3-cent Win the War; 2-cent United Nations; 1-cent Four Freedoms; 3-cent Steamship; 3-cent Telegraph; 3-cent Motion Picture; 3-cent Florida Centennial; 5-cent San Francisco Conference; 1, 2 and 3-cent Roosevelt; 3-cent Two Jims; and 3-cent Army stamps.

All you need to do to purchase stamps from the agency is to make out your order and include return postage and registration fee, mailing your money order to Philatelic Agency, Washington, D. C.

Another service the post office is rendering to the collector is the publication of a booklet containing descriptions and illustrations of all United States postage stamps from 1847 to April 1945 including plate numbers and quantities issued of all commemoratives and air mail postage stamps. This book can be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington 25, D. C., for 30 cents, cash or money order.

The navy stamp will be issued at Annapolis, Md., on Oct. 27. This will be a blue stamp with a picture of a group of smiling sailors. Speaking of the navy stamp, this one will please James Curto of Rivard boulevard, who has a favorite collection of navy covers and cancellations, also navy launchings. He also collects money that was issued on our battle-ships years ago. One of his prize covers was cancelled in Tokyo Bay on Sept. 2, with a special V-J cancellation, the day we landed in Tokyo. Mr. Curto's daughter, Mary, is navy conscious, too, being a petty officer in the navy.

Hil Best of Nottingham road, has just been appointed director of the Society of Australian Philatelists, a group specializing in stamps from "down under." Mr. Best is also director of the Society of Philatelic Americans.
