# SERVICE PARADE

Shanghai. — Lieut. (jg) Frederic J. Schreiber, USNR, 37, of 227 Chalante, Grosse Pointe, carried an unlucky number through a lucky voyage to be among the first American naval personnel to move into Shanghai, China, after the end of hostilities.

The unit which carried this distinction was organized under the mysterious name of NABU 13 — or Naval Advance Base Unit 13. Members of the group, most of them Seabees, were the first Americans to move through the Yangtze and Wangpoo rivers in eight years, since shortly after the ill-fated Panay had been bombed and sunk in 1937.

The group of LST's (landing ships, tank) which brought the unit to Shanghai from their organizing point at Calceone, Samar Island, stopped en route at Okinawa to rendezvous with their escorting vessels and to take on necessary supplies.

The trip was marked by foul weather, including two typhoons, and the exploding of a floating mine that rocked one of the LST's, but the most serious casualty was the "dunking" of one of the crewmen, who was promptly rescued by his mates.

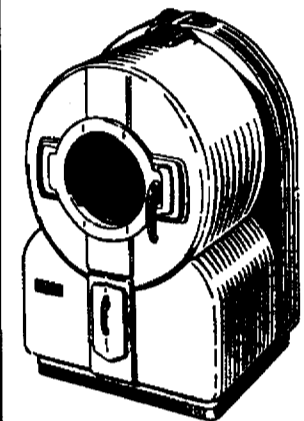

the thousands of refugee children in that country. By boat and automobile he toured Holland. He went through Belgium accompanied by public health officials and also spent many days in France. He conferred with school authorities, public officials and child welfare workers and has acquired a knowledge of conditions in the devastated countries such as is possessed by few people.

In announcing the forthcoming lecture, Mrs. Herndon Wagers, education chairman for the Junior League of Detroit, said: "Our group in Detroit has been particularly fortunate in inducing Dr. Kershner to come here for this lecture. His wide experience in relief work gives him unusual qualifications as observer and reporter. While he was directing the work of the "temporary council on food for Europe's children," he became known as one of the most forceful and interesting speakers in the United States. We can promise that it will be an interesting and inspiring lecture." The league feels that the situation in Europe as to food and fuel shortages will be appalling this winter and public opinion must be aroused to immediate action.

**Stamp Pointers  
AND  
Pointers' Stamps**

by WARD H. ALKEMA

When the late President Roosevelt  
was asked by an old friend to sug-  
gest what stamps his young daughter  
should collect, the President said he  
was delighted to hear that she was  
going to become a philatelist and  
with his ever keen sense of humor  
said that one should first of all know  
how to pronounce the word.

He suggested to his friend that  
South America was one of the best  
fields for a new collector, stating  
that Europe was very dull, too  
many people collected United States  
stamps and that British colonies  
offered a rather high priced field. He  
advised that a good way to start  
would be to get a loose leaf album,  
a Scott's catalogue, some stamp  
hinges and about five dollars worth  
of "mixture" i.e. hundreds of loose  
common stamps from the country or  
countries selected.

South America does offer a large  
field of low priced and interesting  
stamps, and some of them are of  
historic interest. At the time the  
United States was about to build the  
canal, and congress was deciding to  
put it through Nicaragua, one of the  
senators gave stamps of Nicaragua  
showing an erupting volcano to the  
other senators. This influenced their  
decision to put the canal through  
Panama.

Stamps have at times almost  
caused wars. One of the Dominican  
Republic stamps, showing a map of  
the island, almost pushed Haiti into  
the ocean. And Bolivia resented  
Paraguay issuing a stamp showing a  
map of the Chaco region. Argentina  
had to re-issue a stamp when they  
infringed on the territory of Chile.  
Even Great Britain protested their  
claim to the Falkland Islands on this  
stamp.

The different republics have been  
very prolific in issuing stamps to  
honor us. Whether it was really to  
honor us or to sell more stamps is  
another matter. George Washington,  
Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Jefferson,  
and last, Woodrow Wilson, Grover  
Cleveland, Theodore Roosevelt,  
Franklin D. Roosevelt, Charles  
Lindbergh, Samuel Morse, Alexander  
Graham Bell, and Will Rogers  
have all been honored on their  
stamps. Our Constitution, the New  
York World's Fair, and the Gold-  
en Gate Exposition have also been  
made subjects for their stamps.

There will be two new stamps this  
month. The Coast Guard stamp on  
Nov. 10 and the Alfred E. Smith  
stamp on Nov. 26. New York City  
will have the first day sale for both  
stamps.

Brazil was the second country in  
the world to adopt the use of post-  
age stamps, having their first stamp  
in 1843. These are known as the  
Bull's Eyes.

The Pan American Union has a  
number of booklets on the stamps of  
the Latin-American countries and  
also stamps which can be purchased  
from them. You may send to them  
for a list of these. Their address is:

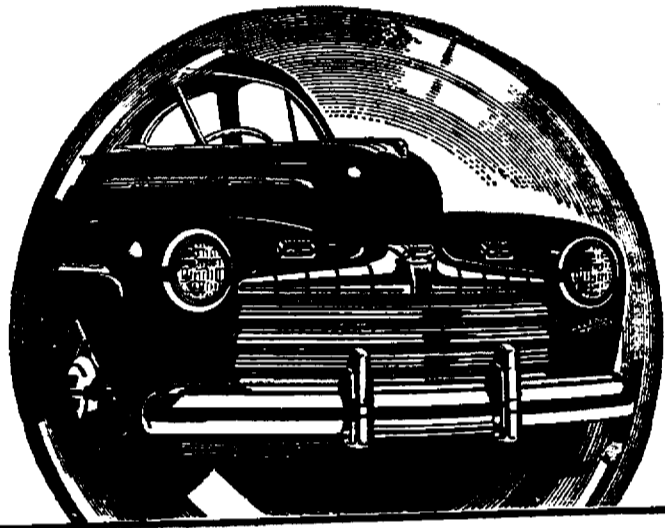

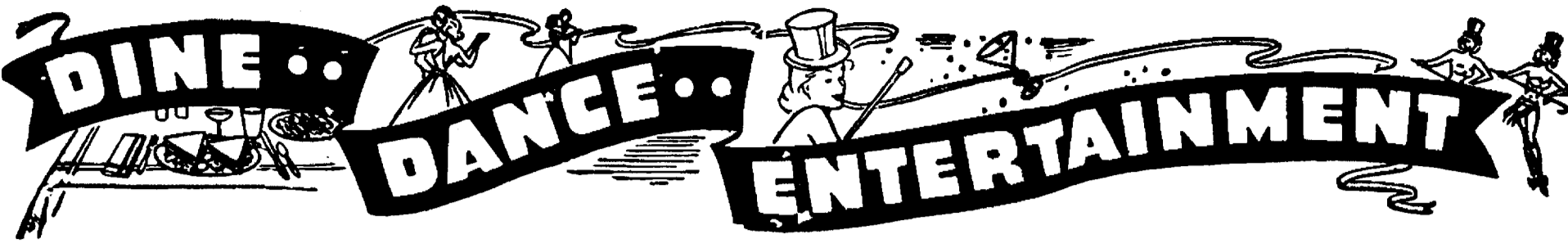

**St. Ambrose Graduate Describes Rescue Following October Typhoon at Okinawa**

A storm abated—a local sailor had survived the destruction of a second ship, and "Hose Nose" went with over the first real tree he had ever seen. "Hose Nose" is strictly a ship-raised dog, mascot to the crew of the USS PC-814 which was battered to pieces during the recent typhoon at Okinawa. The sailor is Gunner's Mate George Berlinger, of 1142 Newport, who had the U.S.S. Cooner blown from under him in the battle of Orinac Bay, invasion of Leyte, Dec. 5, 1944. He is a graduate of St. Ambrose high school.

It was the second of the two typhoons and twice as fierce as the first one. It lasted about thirty hours, eight of which the 814 rode out at sea with its radar and radios out of commission. The wind was howling past at 120 miles while the ship pitched and rolled at 50 degrees; any moment it was expected to go all the way over and sink. After a harrowing night, the 814 finally came to rest in two feet of water on a reef about two miles off shore. Her hull was full of gapping holes and most of the compartments were flooded. Her back broken, the ship was abandoned along with 39 of her sister craft which were beached or sunk in one little cover of the bay.

In his diary-like letter, he goes on to recall the days that followed.

Oct. 11: "We left our ship high and dry when a landing craft came along and took us off. We are living in pup tents on terraces the Japs used for growing food."

Oct. 12: "Although I slept on a slant last night, I slept like a log. It rained some but it didn't bother me

much. We found some mosquito netting and used it at the entrance to the tent to keep out the mosquitoes at night and the grasshoppers, etc., during the day. The bay is like glass now. It is hard to believe it could ever have been calm again. Nelson, my tent-mate, and I had a shower this morning. There is a waterfall and a little pool we can sit in and take a bath. It sure is refreshing. All the guys spend their time making crazy contraptions and it's easy to see how many belonged to the Scouts back home. We found a flag and it is flying over the group of tents.

"Hose Nose" is raising cane. He has never seen green grass or a tree before. We are eating K rations and food from the ship. The coffee and food are not bad. Still — a guy doesn't appreciate a clean, dry ship until he has lived on a beach for a while."

Oct. 16: "I've lost all track of dates. Yesterday we moved out of the pup tents and are now living in tents capable of holding eight men and their gear. Five other guys and myself rigged up a platform floor and we all have nesting over our bunks (army cots). I slept on an even keel last night and am really comfortable now. It's noon and we are going down the road to the N.O.B. ship's service to back the cocoa cola line. We will then pick up some K rations and air mail stamps and stop by the Red Cross for coffee. The "Doc" and I took baths and shaved in our private water hole this morning. It rained for about twenty-four hours the last two days but the sun is shining now and it is hotter than ever."

"What's new on the Eastern Front?" he continues. "Every time I see any of those little Japs in working details, I can't imagine how they caused the world so much trouble. It is like a chapter from Robinson Crusoe — the account this boy sends home. Maybe he doesn't know how the Japs started all the trouble. But he has had enough to know how it ended and who did the job.
