### **MUCC** Report

The Michigan Unemployment Compensation Commission paid \$701,908 less in unemployment benefits and readjustment allowances during the week end-ing August 17 than during the preceding week, Eugene T. Dormer, Executive Director of the Commission, announced today.

The number of unemployed receiving benefits dropped 5,872 during the week and all but 500 of this decrease was in the Detroit metropolitan area.

The Commission paid 59,196 industrial claimants a total of \$1,274,532 from the Michigan Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund. A total of 49,122 World War II veterans received \$1,274,805 in readjustment allowances under the G.I. Bill of Rights, bringing the total paid during the week to Michigan's unemployed to \$2,549,337.

Figures show a sharp drop in rightes allow a sharp drop in initial claims, with 2,630 less people filing than during the preceding week. The total of initial claims number 5,793, of At Low Rates which number, 2,466 claims were filed by women.

In the Detroit metropolitan area, the Commission paid a total of \$1,477,938 to 66,990 claimants. Of those filing claims, 27,787 were veterans and 24,166 mere women.

#### Freezing Process **Need Not Darken** Sliced Peaches

If those peach slices you put away in your freezer locker last year became dark, it was likely because you did not take the special precautions necessary to prevent discoloration. Dr. Roy E. Marshall, research specialist in the department of horticulture at Michigan State college, says certain enzymes cause discoloration and these must be killed or their action stopped by simple but necessary treat-

of preventing darkening of peach slices for fruit going into lockers is the use of crystalline ascorbic acid in the sirup. This is available from drug stores and also from many of the com-mercial locker plants. Dr. Marshall suggests the following method of preparation.

The most satisfactory method

Peaches may be peeled by scalding, followed by immersion in cold water and then removin the peel. The peaches are ther pitted and sliced. If the fruit is to be packed in

a 35-percent sirup, each gailon of sirup would be made from 3 quarts of water, 7 cups of sugar, and 1½ teaspoons of crystalline ascorbic acid, the temperature should not exceed 125 degrees and stirring should not result in excessive agitation. higher heat would cause loss of scorbic acid through oxidation. After the sugar and ascorbic acid are thoroughly dissolved, the sirup should be cooled. It may then be added to the peach slices in the freezing cartons until the level of sirup is above that of the slices. Care should be taken to prevent any portion of the slices from protruding above the sirup. Use approximately one part of sirup to 3 parts of peaches by weight.

The packaged fruit is then ready for freezing and storage.



Purpose of the study was to find out what types of books have most interest for students courses of study for maximum

interest. Lag in reading interest in the upper grades does not necesarily mean that those studdents are learning less, Prof. Woody adds. As pupils advance in age, they become more in-terested in doing things than in reading about them and there are also demands upon the time







### THE CAMERA CORNER

#### Care And Feeding Of Your Camera

Your camera is like a gun. Treat it right and it will shoot straight. Neglect it and you can't depend on it. Neglect it and you can't depend on it.

The camera of today is a carefully made, finely adjusted piece of machinery. But it's made by human hands: it's not a box of magic. Like a good watch or a good car it needs care and occasionally a thorough overhaul. Don't wait till something goes wrong and you miss the best picture of your life. And let an expert do the overhauling—don't trust tinkerers.

tinkerers. Your lens may be simple or it may Your lens may be simple or it may case, it's the most valuable and valuerable part of your camera. Keep it clean, but not by blowing on it and wiping it with a dirty handker-chief. Unless, of course, you prefer to have the delicate aurface marred to have the delicate aurface marred to the course. by scratches. Wipe it lightly with a piece of soft lens cleaning tissue or clean lines without lint. If it is costed with dust and grease, use a drop or two of lens cleaning fluid available in any camera store.

Keep It Stored Properly

Dust collects when the camers is laid up between pictures. So keep the camera well protected, in its case or in a clean, dry drawer. Those camera swank: they protect the camera from injury and they simplify your clean ing problem. Even in its case, keep it away from heat.

Dust and grit get inside your carnera, too, and may settle on the surface of the film as well as the inner face of the lens. Either condition will produce small black specks on your prints. Again, keep it clean, inside

Once a year or oftener, depending on the punishment it has taken, your camera should be inspected for light leaks, for internal dirt in the lens. for the operation of the diaphragm and shutter and for the film carrying

Good Loading Habits Good camera habite are just as im

portant when you're out to take picture. Never load film in direcsunlight. The film is well protected he backin, paper and packing, but why take a chance on light fog? Suppose you still have film in the

camera but can't remember whether you turned it to the next exposure after that last snapshot. Establish an ironclad habit of winding the film immediately after every exposure and you'll never be in doubt. Moreover, soull be reads to shoot fast when an unexpected picture opportunity turns




