It Will Take Self Control, Too

Abandonment of Government controls announced by President Truman does not mean that there will be no price control—it merely means that the controls over prices have been shifted from a bureaucratic government into the hands of those to whom they rightfully belong—the Consumer.

In our American system of free and open markets the Consumer has the final word on setting of prices—it was the forced yielding of our free markets during the war that snatched controls over prices from the hands of the public into the Government.

Scarcities will keep prices of some things up for a while but not for long, if the sharp and continued decline in the price of meat since it was decontrolled means anything. People had been meat-hungry for months and months — but they decided they could stand it another month and so passed up those \$1 steaks. Now those steaks are little more than half that.

It will be the same in other commodities which have been scarce for years if the Consumer will remember that he has that power to control prices. Let the consumer exercise restraint and allow prices to soften to a fair level. That will come when supplies are adequate, and supplies won't be adequate if Consumers engage in an uncontrolled auction by meeting increasing prices.

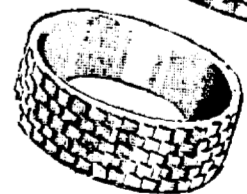
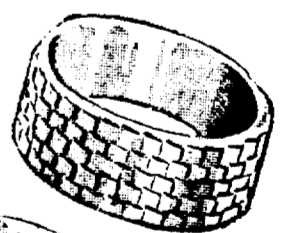
