# NEW SCHOOL HEAD NAMED

## John R. Barnes To Succeed Dr. Paul L. Essert

John R. Barnes has been named superintendent of Grosse Pointe High Schools. He succeeds Dr. Paul L. Essert, who submitted his resignation to accept a post at Columbia University. Mr. Barnes will accept his new office on August 1.

The announcement was made by Dr. Charles A. Parcells, president of the Grosse Pointe Board of Education, following a special meeting of the Board Friday, May 16.

Mr. Barnes and Dr. Essert, who both have served as superintendent of this school one of the best in the nation.

Mr. Barnes, a native of Kansas, had previous experience in school teaching and administration before coming to Grosse Pointe High School as principal in 1930. He graduated from the University of Kansas in 1921, receiving his Master of Arts Degree there in 1923.

He has pursued advanced graduate studies at Teachers College, Columbia. He has served as instructor in Secondary School Administration at the University of Iowa, Kansas and Purdue University. Mr. Barnes has participated in several significant surveys of education, and is the Editor of a textbook in World Literature used in many schools of the nation.

Dr. Essert submitted his resignation to the Board on May 7 to accept an appointment as Professor of Education and Head of the Department of Adult Education at Columbia University.

"It has always been the custom of the Board," continued Dr. Parcells' announcement, "to carefully study its own employees when promotions were in order before going outside the system. Dr. Essert's service as Superintendent of Schools since 1942, left no doubt in the minds of the Board that, in this case, no nationwide search would reveal any educator better equipped to continue the executive direction of the Grosse Pointe Schools."

When interviewed by a representative of this newspaper Mr. Barnes said he felt highly honored by the opportunity to serve the people of Grosse Pointe as Superintendent.

"I have enjoyed all of my work in this community, especially the past five years during which time I have been privileged to serve under the splendid leadership of Dr. Essert," said Mr. Barnes.

Stressing the fine work completed during Dr. Essert's administration, Mr. Barnes said:

"The record of accomplishment in the Grosse Pointe Public Schools in these years is a real challenge to the entire staff and especially to me."

Dr. Parcells said:

"During his service in Grosse Pointe, Mr. Barnes has been directly responsible for outstanding improvements in curriculum and courses of study in both the elementary and secondary schools."

Mr. Barnes is administratively responsible for many of the improvements in the Grosse Pointe Schools.

VILLAGE ASSESSMENT ISSUE

Several weeks ago the Michigan Supreme Court ruled against Grosse Pointe Park and City Lakemont property owners in their fight against the Township for a property assessment refund and reduction.

Undiscouraged by the decision the Grosse Pointe City aggregation began a movement to raise the assessment on the smaller Village homes to reducing their own. They were encouraged in this effort by Detroit's increase of property taxation.

The City Council, working to protect the smaller home owner, denied the lake front group's proposal. The council was determined to keep taxes for smaller home owners at a minimum. However, when these very same people that the council was trying to protect had the opportunity to help reduce their taxes they refused to co-operate.

We mean by this the reaction of the home owners on University Place, St. Clair, Neff and others in the Stalein project area, who were completely opposed to any business development there which would have contributed to Village taxes.

It appears that the smaller home property owner wants lower taxation without making any efforts to obtain them whereas the owners of the lakefront estates are obviously making every effort to keep their assessment at a minimum.

The question, "What Group Deserves the Most Consideration?" is easily answered.

STRAY DOGS ARE MENACE

Grosse Pointe Township's means of handling the stray dog problem is a disgrace to the community.

Only two of the five Villages have dog wagons. The Parks and Farms police departments have reasonable facsimile of adequate dog wagons. They are makeshift carts which are hitched to the police scout cars.

The rest of the police departments use their scout cars for chasing and transporting stray animals.

In the meantime the township's number of stray dogs have increased double fold and the police departments with their limited facilities cannot do too much about it.

At present police officers are forced to chase stray animals and carry on the duties of a dog catcher while in uniform. We believe this conduct is disrespectful to the police department.

Stray dogs are a menace to the health and safety of Grosse Pointe. This community's method of fighting that menace is incomplete.

Pointe Chiefs Attend State Safety Meeting

Grosse Pointe was fully represented at the 19th annual Michigan Safety Conference held in Detroit May 20, 21 and 22 to study ways of combating the mounting death and injury toll in "accidents that should never happen."

The local delegation included the five police chiefs of Grosse Pointe Township. The conference was divided into five classifications of safety, including traffic law enforcement, industrial, public utility, transportation, school and college, engineering and planning, mayors' and city managers' safety programs and the women's division of home safety.

Because highway accidents claim the largest fatality and injury toll of any of the classifications, the major attention was set on the sessions of the law enforcement division, of which State Attorney General Eugene F. Black is chairman.

Although automobile fatalities in Michigan have shown a decline per 100 million miles of travel, the total number of deaths has increased, amounting to 1,444 in 1945 as compared to 1,150 in 1944. In addition, 34,479 persons were injured in highway accidents in 1945 as compared to 27,755 in 1944.

Governor Kim Sigler spoke at the conference banquet Wednesday evening.

Sponsors of the conference are Michigan State Safety Commission, Michigan Department of Labor and Industry, Detroit Industrial Safety Council, Lansing Safety Council, Traffic Safety Association of Detroit and the Greater Grand Rapids Safety Council.

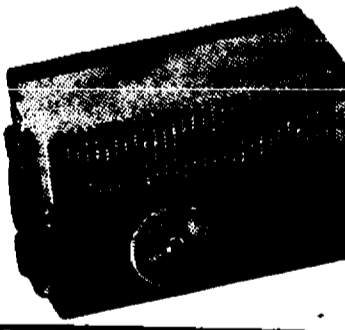

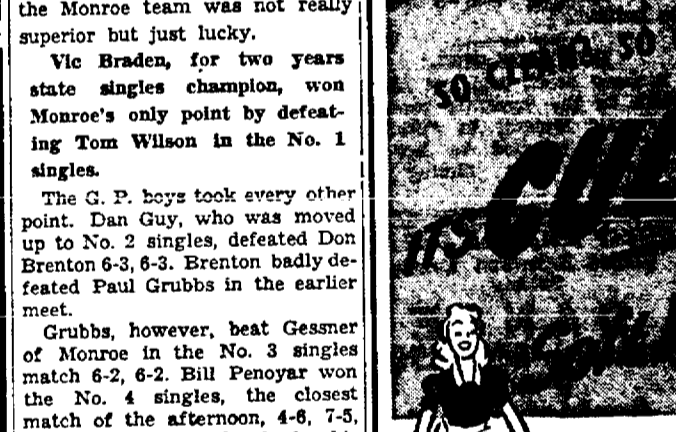


**HEILMANN TEACHES 'FRECKLES'**

Harry Heilmann, who will act as one of the judges in the Grosse Pointe Review's "Why I Would Like To Meet My Favorite Ballplayer," is one of the immortals of baseball. He will be remembered throughout the history of the game for his work with the bat.  
 His importance as a player was first as a slugger and second as an outfielder. During his 14 years in the major leagues, Harry had a personality that 'his just as many home runs as did his hickory war-club. It was said of him in 1925, when his career was at its peak, that Heilmann was the most popular player in baseball.
