# ARAGRAPHS Mayor Netting Willing To Accept 2nd Term Announces And Bus Line Announces Increase

Bus fares to and from Detroit and Grosse Pointe will be upped 5 cent beginning Saturday, November 1. Present fare is 10 cents

The announcement was made by Walter Schweikart, president of the Lake Shore Coach Lines who said the company was forced to make the 5 cent hike due to the rising cost of labor and operation.

## HITS THOUSANDS

Lake Shore Lines is the only company operating an exclusive bus service for this area. The fare boost hits thousands of Pointers who ride Lake Shore buses

daily. The increase will not affect school children or inter-Grosse Pointe Township transportation.

School children of Grosse Pointe and St. Clair Shores will continue to be able to purchase ten tickets for 60 cents to be used during the hours of 7 a.m. to 6 p. m. each school day.

In a statement to this newspaper, President Schweikart said: "Our employees have asked that their contract with the company be re-opened on the question of wages and they be paid an increase to meet the raised cost of living, and we advised them that under the revenue that we are taking in, it would be impossible to pay them any more money unless we raised our fares. The

"In addition the increase is necessary to permit the company to catch up with the rising costs of doing business. In general, bus fares of today are the same as in 1932, although the cost of everything used in providing bus service has risen sharply.

"We have on order new buses and unless we operate on a sound financial basis, banks will not loan us the money to buy them, and no such assurance has been pro-



## FIRE PREVENTION WEEK

Calling on the nation to join in a concerted effort to prevent fires, President Truman has proclaimed the week children during the first semester beginning October 5 as Fire Prevention Week.

In his proclamation, the President said: "I earnestly request every citizen to eliminate all possible causes for destructive fire in his home and place of business." That plea goes to the heart of fire prevention. The many organizations whose business it is to fight fire are doing a magnificent job, and their efforts have been brought to a peak of intensity this year. But they cannot do much without public support. The nation cannot provide an army of fire prevention experts to inspect every home and business building, correct dangers, and see that they stay corrected. All the authorities can do is to tell us how to prevent fire—and after that it is up to the individual.

If anyone doubts that fire prevention has assumed the stature of an emergency condition, he need only look at the Mothers' Club. statistics. During the first six months of 1947 alone, fire losses in the United States reached the staggering total of \$369,276,000—and that does not include the major portion to provide an opportunity for paof the Texas City disaster. Loss of life has shown a similar increase. In most homes a very small expenditure of time and money will eliminate the common hazards—and interests of the students through no investment can produce better returns.
