In his proclamation, the President said: "I earnestly request every citizen to eliminate all possible causes for destructive fire in his home and place of business."

If anyone doubts that fire prevention has assumed the stature of an emergency condition, he need only look at the statistics. During the first six months of 1947 alone, fire losses in the United States reached the staggering total of \$369,276,000—and that does not include the major portion of the Texas City disaster.

Now, however, with this great increase in home building, the schools are again faced with the tremendous task of keeping up in the race to provide adequate school facilities.

The new school building which is now being constructed at Vernier and Mack and which the School Board hopes will be ready for occupancy by the second semester of this year, in addition to the present schools, will amply care for the elementary enrollment of pupils from the Woods, Shores, and Gratiot Township for possibly a two- or three-year period.

BIDS SOUGHT

As announced in this newspaper last week, the Board of Education has advertised for bids which will be opened on October 24 for the first unit of the new Kerby School.

With the completion of these two new schools, the Board of Education feels confident that the elementary school children in the eastern end of the school district will be well cared for at that time.

Mr. Bert Wicking, President of the Board of Education, said that the Board will give constant study to the trend in home building and that it will make every effort to keep the community informed on the anticipated needs for additional school facilities which are almost certain to come.

SALEM MEMORIAL LUTHERAN CHURCH

Salem Memorial To Hold Dedication Ceremonies

Sunday, October 5th will mark a great day in the history of Salem Memorial Lutheran Church, located on Morosse Road at Chester. For on that day the church will be dedicated to the glory of the Trine God. Altho the church has been in use for some time, there were many things to wait for before dedication could take place. These items arrived about the middle and latter part of the summer.

Two services will be conducted on this day. The first service will be in the morning at 10:30 a. m. at which time the Rev. N. A. Menter, president of the Michigan district of the American Lutheran Church, will speak. Dr. Menter was the power behind the beginning of Salem Memorial. While still pastor of Salem Lutheran Church, Dr. Menter saw the need of a church in this territory and it was not difficult to convince the church council of this need. This resulted in the purchase of the present site about 5 years ago and the beginning of construction on the present building about two years ago. The edifice was completed in 1946 ago. The second service will take place in the afternoon at 3:30 p. m. at which time the Rev. Theo. J. Pretzloff, present pastor of Salem Lutheran Church will speak.

Following the service in the afternoon the ladies of the congregation will serve a buffet supper. A free-will offering will be taken.

On Wednesday, October 8 at 8 p. m. a special dedication communion service will be held. This service will take the place of the regular communion service held on the second Sunday of the month.

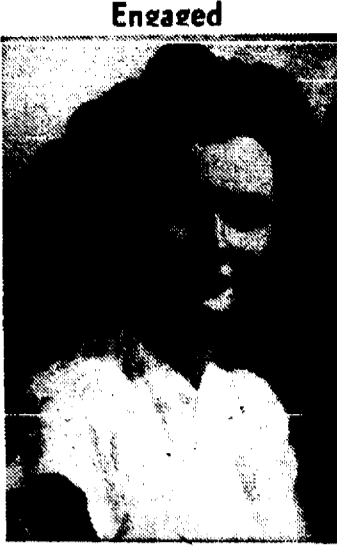

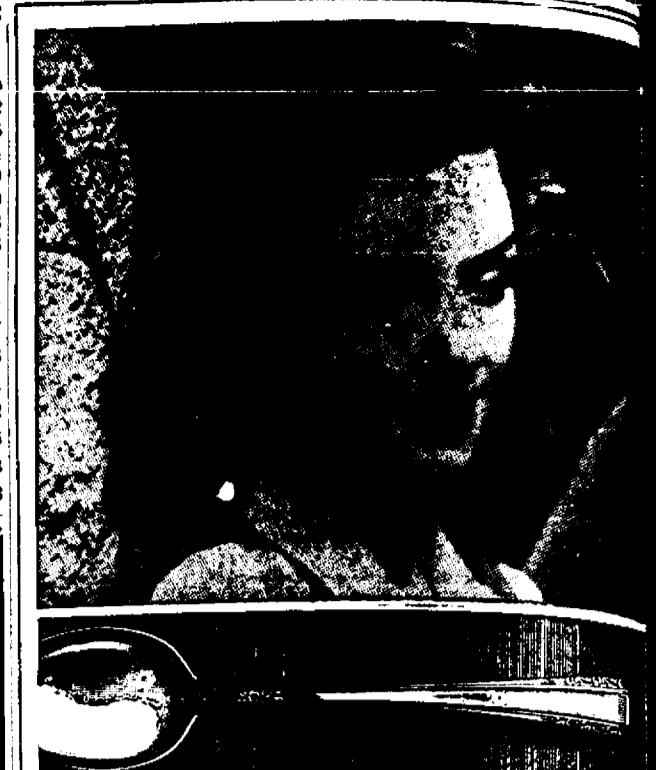
