Their survey also indicated that the construction of a building to accommodate all postal service requirements and off - the - street driveways and parking would cost approximately \$50,000.

When the survey was undertaken in 1944, the government was intending to let some private contractor erect the building. However, due to the great material and labor shortages, contractors shunned the project completely.
