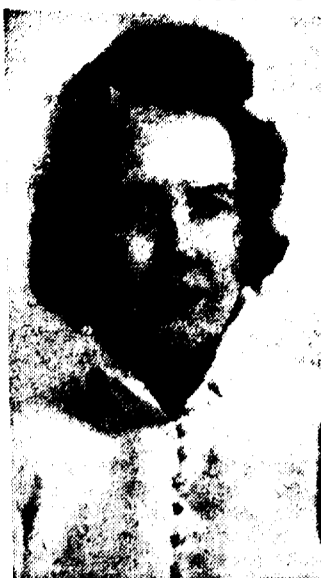

Pointe Oarsmen Make Favorable Showing In Season's Opener

By JOHN HUTTON Grosse Pointers played important roles as club oarsmen from the Detroit area held their first competition of the 1948 season on the Detroit River at Trenton, Michigan recently. The regatta was of considerable importance because it was the only competition which the local crews will see until the Olympic trials and National Championships at Princeton, N. J., and Philadelphia this week. It was also the first appearance of the Jud Ross newly-formed Detroit Rowing Club which is comprised of Grosse Pointers who formerly rowed for Ross at the Detroit Boat Club.

TOOMEY COACHES The Boat Club now coached by Bob Toomey caused somewhat of a surprise by its very favorable showing, despite the fact that all but a handful of its oarsmen resigned at the end of last season, forcing Toomey to rely almost entirely on green men this year. The D. B. C. captured both the junior heavy and junior lightweight eight oared races, while Wyandotte B. C., the only club which did not have Grosse Pointers in its boats, took the senior heavy and light eights.

GOOD SHOWING The D. B. C. jr. lightweight eight entered in the senior race against Wyandotte and Ecorse and made a very good showing against their more experienced opponents. It finished 3rd only 4 seconds behind Wyandotte's winning time of 5:9. The coxswain of the crew was Dick Ryan, a Grosse Pointer who was a member of GPHS crews in 1943, '45 and '46. Other Pointers in the boat were Bill Queen bow, Jim Connors 3 and John Hutton 6. The balance of the crew were, Fred Palmer stroke, Dick Palmer 7, Gene Clidade 5, Pat Grain 4 and Bob Pounds 2.

This crew later returned to the course and whipped Ecorse and Wyandotte jr. lightweight eights by a length and 4 lengths respectively. Their time of 5:6 was 7 seconds better than in their previous race and would have been fast

enough to have won the senior event.

SULLIVAN ROWS

The DBC junior heavy eight which has only two men stroke John Eichenlaub and Danny Sullivan 2, who rowed before this spring, plus coxswain George Hubbard, who was in GPHS crews and at Marietta University led all the way to take the jr. heavy event ahead of Ecorse and Wyandotte jr. heavies in 5:5. They returned to the starting line later to oppose two highly rated Wyandotte boats and a powerful Ecorse crew in the feature event of the regatta, the senior heavy eights. The stern four of the Ecorse crew was composed of 4 Grosse Pointers who formerly rowed at the DBC. They were Bob Beaupre stroke, Bob Steiger 7, Jack McKenzie 6 and Jules Huebner 5. All but McKenzie rowed in Ross' DBC crews that swept the U. S. Nationals in 1946. McKenzie and Huebner rowed in the GPHS eight that won the U. S. National Schoolboy title in 1944. However, they finished a poor 3rd two lengths behind the DBC aggregate, that was only three quarters of a length behind Wyandotte, which won in the good time of 4:49. At the half marker the smooth rowing Dottes were a length and a half in front of the DBC, but Hubbard brought his crew to within 3/4 of a length at the finish and they were gaining rapidly. The balance of DBC crew was Ed Gerbowski 7, Lou Brown 6, Pat Costello 5, Bill Taylor 4, John Raynor 3, and Mel Free bow. The only other race involving Grosse Pointers was the Sr. lightweight doubles in which Dick Jackson and Bill Holliday of the new Detroit Rowing Club finished 2nd behind an Ecorse duo. While rowing at the DBC in 1946 they won the U. S. National 145 lb.

Besides being potent at the plate, Bob, who is a St. Ambrose senior, limited his opponents to three hits. The victory marked the young righthander's second win in two starts in the American Legion League. This feat, coupled with his six wins and two defeats in the Parochial School League, gives Bob a fine record thus far this season.
