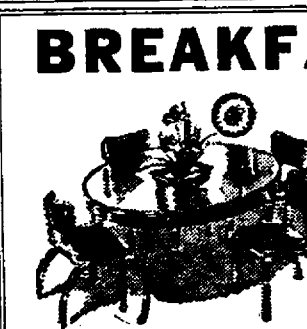

**DUS Grid Coach Is Optimistic About Squad**

 Despite a 26 to 0 defeat at the hands of a bigger and more experienced Cranbrook eleven, Coach Bill Yeager of Detroit University School is optimistic about his team's chances as they prepare to meet at Atkinson Field, Junction and McGraw, Detroit, at 2:30 p.m.  
 Coach Yeager was particularly impressed by the fine showing of his veteran quarterback Bill Hamilton.  
 Following are the highlights of last week's contest at Birmingham.  
 Cranbrook, using a series of modified T formations was sparked by the brilliant backfield running of Carlson Jones, the Blue and Grey right halfback.

Jones introduced his football adversary by running 47 yards to the DUS three yard line on the opening play of the game. He marked one up for Cranbrook two downs later when he scooted across the line and into the end zone.


