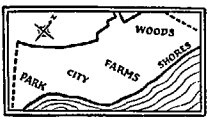

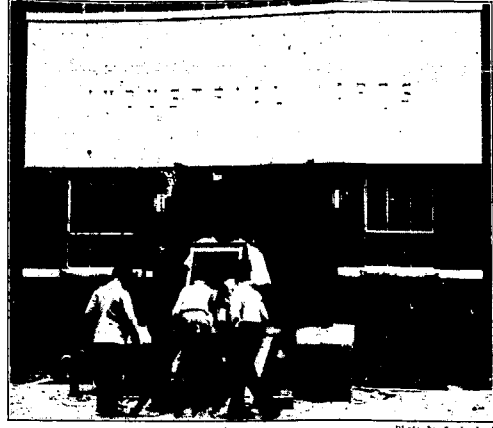

Rabaut Sponsors Bill for Relief

Representative Louis C. Rabaut has introduced a bill in Congress to provide for temporary relief payments to persons who have been displaced by the war effort.

It was just a month ago that the president asked that such an appropriation be made to help those who have been thrown out of work because of the conversion of industrial plants from the production of peacetime goods to the production of war materials.

When the Ways and Means committee tabled legislation that would provide this needed relief, Congressman Rabaut immediately introduced his bill which would authorize \$20,000,000 to be turned over to the president as an emergency fund to provide the necessary relief.

Mr. Rabaut pointed out that the reason for this action is threefold: "To supplement the regular compensation benefits to reduce needless migration of war workers, and to encourage training for the transfer to essential war production." The purpose of the proposed legislation, as set forth in the bill, is "to expedite the production of war materials."
