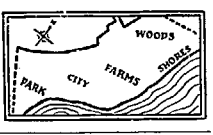

15 Per Cent Of Qualified In Last Three Years

Survey Reveals 8000 Park, Farms And Woods Go To Polls

More new homes were constructed in Grosse Pointe during 1941 than in any previous year on record, according to a survey just completed by L. M. Bartlett, director of child accounting and adjustment of the Pointe public school system.

Arts Building May Run 24 Hours Per Day

The Grosse Pointe Board of Education at its regular Monday night unanimously approved the recommendation of Dr. Paul L. Esbert, superintendent of schools, to defend production training classes be set up in the shop building and possibly office machinery practice building after the regular school hours, and when satisfactory negotiations can be concluded with state and federal government officials for the organization of this work.

The defense production training classes are being carried on in many countries in the country in order to increase the number of skilled men necessary for the production of war materiel.

Although the program is financed by the federal government through the State Board of Vocational Education, the organization and operation of the classes is sponsored by the local schools.

Turn it Excellent

According to the State Board of Vocational Education, the organization of these classes will be the new plan and equipment offered in each of these fields:

Learning to Protect Pointe

(1) Classes of thirty hours per week for ten weeks for unemployed, which would probably be carried on between midnight and 6 o'clock in the morning.

(2) Classes of fifteen hours per week for twenty weeks for people working in non-defense industries which would probably be held between 8 o'clock and 11 o'clock in the evening.

(3) Classes for workers in defense industries of six hours a week for fifty weeks which would probably be held on Saturdays or possibly Sundays. This kind of program of course would, according to Dr. Esbert, keep the industrial arts equipment and plant in use practically twenty-four hours a day, for the regular school program which is now going on would not be disturbed.

In giving their approval to negotiations for such a plan, the Board of Education indicated that they were interested in making every effort that is within the power of public schools to help win the war, and according to Charles A. Parcell, "since Detroit's major contribution to the winning of this war is in its tremendous industrial resources, one of the best things that is in the public schools which can do in this area is to see that there are no bottlenecks."

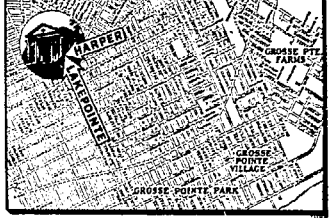

Jack Chamberlin Describes Life in London's Air Raids

Last November when Jack Chamberlin, 24, of 288 Hillcrest, became the first Grosse Pointe to fly to London, he was not a military aviator in England's newly formed Civilian Technical Corps, as he promised The News he would later when we heard him continue his story from the theater building. The picture was flashed on the screen "The Air Raid Warning Back" so we turned our lights back and leaned out the window (the moon was full) and the German plane went over almost within our reach. 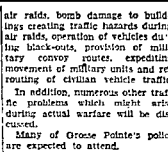
