The American Commonwealth will celebrate its 166th Independence Day on Saturday. Of all these days that have gone before, since the reading of the immortal document from the hand of the young Jefferson in Philadelphia on that sultry day in 1776, not any have approximated in seriousness of occasion, in deadly peril to the nation or in its appeal to patriotic deed and sacrifice the case shifts will break have rus the day after tomorrow. one which will break over us the day after tomorrow

How the works will becaute the set in the making in the Eastern Mediterranean and on the Russian front which we may shortly discover will have a more factful bearing on the course of future life in our country than did Bunker Hill, Saratoga or Vorktown.

It is a most auxious moment. It weights upon the mind and heart of the average American man and woman There is a reluctance to discuss in general conversation the implications of the hour. A sliont prayer issues from millions of hearts that this peril may pass.

millions of hearts that this peril may pass. But as the clouds thicken and as the dangers to our beloved America multiply there should come to this people a new hardening of purpose to carry on through any adversities that fate can pile up against us. This ansious Fourth of July is the fitting moment in which America must reaffirm its unalterable allegiance to the cause of human freedom. If the danger that confronts us today is the greatest in our history, so are the resources at our command with which to meet this peril incomparably greater than ever before.

Today we are engaged in a total war. This means that all of the resources of all of the people are pledged and made available for the sole purpose of achieving victory. Those nations which oppose us have long since accustomed their people to this type of conflict. We can only win, we can only survive, by fighting with these same total resources. only win, we ca total resources.

In this time of danger any thought or act which doe stem direct to the national purpose of victory in war i rest kin to treason.

The will for victory is weakened by criticism or re-crimination. There is no time or that. The average Ameri-can, those who in the mass must carry on and win this war, can only do their individual best as the time and place for service is indicated to them and as their inmost conscience guides them.

conscience guides them. This sombre Fourth of July 1942 should suggest to the American people a renewal of faith and service. It might well mark the ascending point of a new heroic age in our history to be recalled with pride henceforth by the living generation and forever remembered by those who succeed us.

Gold - Off and On

Chairman Eccles of the Federal Reserve dropped a bombshell in the House Banking and Currency committee the other day when he told its members that this country was definitely off the gold standard whether it knew it or not. The statement must have been equally jarring to Mr. Morgenthau and President Rossevelt who thought they were doing a smart thing when they started to corner all the monetary gold in the world by buying it with good of gold when the price had formerly been \$20.67 an ounce since the cargs of our great granddadies.

They reckoned that by putting up the price of gold they would increase the price of the things dollars buy but, as Mr. Eccles survely put if, it didn't work out that way. There was much talk at the time the gold buying orgy started about making this country a good place in which foreigners might buy but a hard place to sell. In actual practice our good friends in Europe bought from us only the things they had to have and seldom the things we most desired to sell. As a mitter of fact they bought our money rather than our merchandise. To see to it that their people should not be subjected to any undue templation to buy in our market the countries all over continental Europe began setting up a quota system, under German lead, which, as a barrier against foreign importa-tions, made our hest efforts in the glad oil days of tariffs reaching into the clouds seem like kindergarten exercises. Our zold buying oncerations atlaned only a nartial

Our gold buying operations attained only a partial objective and that only as long as they had gold to sell us and brother, they dug up lots of it. Even dear old England, who has always exhibited an historic fondness for the dull yearnings, at an incidental profit of seventy-five cents in every dollar.

And then one Horace Greely Schachts, he of the Reichsbank, proposed the attractive theory that a man-aged currency would make gold unnecessary, and lo! it was done, and Germany, who, on our basis of gold support for ner circulating medium would have had six mills on the dollar had her gold been employed that way, pro-ceeded to carry on a lively foreign trade by a system of barter in which the government acted as broker.

GROSSE POIN would have been that the whole world is always on a gold standard whether, it knows it or not. Gold has been from time immemorial a recognized basis of monetary value. Managed currencies may be temporary expediencies which can be made to work rather well for a time within the political confines of individual states and bartering arrangements substituted momentarily as a medium of trade between countries, but eventually trade, whether intrantional or international, gravitates to a position of dependency upon a currency which is hased upon 'that thing which has been uccepted as a common measure of such a common measurement of monetary values, with each individual nation stirving to maintain its currency values of every other state; unveils a vista of confusion far nothing but gold has appeared to fill this role. It may well be that when the final disposition of the

Iar nothing but goid has appeared to hit this role. It may well be that when the finall disposition of the world's problems following this war are to be made it will be arranged for a division of the world's monetary gold on some basis proportionate to the needs of the individual states and their place in international trade.

But for the moment Mr. Eccles remarks may be re garded as an interesting aside on one of the many "rescue" schemes of the present administration which did not work

Quite possibly the plan of Mr. Roosevelt and the Professors which fell short of its immediate objective may prove in the long run to have been a happy error. The possession of the vast eache at Fort Knox will be a mightly talking item at the final council table where economic disposition will occupy a place on the agenda equal in importance to the political and military decisions.




