In a very few days the people of Michigan are going to decide at the polls whether or not those of their number who reside in Wayne County are to be privileged by a special provision in the state constitution to set up a new structure of county government, which for convenience sake has been popularly called "Home Rule."

Those who would be affected by this change, the residents of Wayne County, constitute probably somewhat less than two fifths of the state's population.

The primary change that would be effected in the county government, if the Home Rule amendment prevails, would be the abolition of the present cumbersome Board of 161 County Supervisors and the substitution therefor of a small and more efficient group of 21 regularly elected supervisors from duly designated subdivisions of

The present unwieldy Board of Supervisors is even-less representative of the people than appears, as up-wards of fifty of its number find their places on the Board under a system of selection somewhat akin to the archaic "Rotten Boroughs" scheme that prevailed in England a century ago.




