#### The Election Warning

A near vote of "no confidence" is about what a war time President must expect in a mid-term election. All the dissatisfaction with the conduct of the war, all of the inconveniences, great or small, that the war has entailed, every angle and phase of the war that can be construed as a personal responsibility of the President comes back on his head and on the political party which he leads and very largely compands largely commands.

There is nothing new or unexpected in the situation: in fact it was quite the expected. In the last big war President Wilson narrowly escaped a complete overthrow of his party in the House in the November, 1918 election, despite the fact that that war was going vastly better for him then than this one has been going for Fresident Roosevelt.

But Wilson had had to grapple with an aircraft scandal, in which \$600,000,000 had been squandered for construction without a single plane having left the ground, and the casualty lists, then widely published, were mounting to tertifying proportions in the Meuse-Argonne offensive of October. '18. After the manner of democracies, a frightened or anner upblic must have it scanegoes the scanegoe frightened or angry public must have its scapegoat and this naturally is the President or his political group.

Even the Great Lincoln, now almost a sainted figure in our company of national heroes, had serious opposition from "Little Mac," Gen. Geo. B. McClellan, the original American "Man on Horseback" and deposed Commander of the Army of the Potomac, as his rival for the Presidency in 1864.

It is all a part of the role of the Head of the State. He gets kudos or knocks as the mercury of public opinion registers. Mr. Roosevelt rode high, wide and handsome during the many years in which he was doubling the national debt in a time of profound peace and ladding out the public money to anybody who needed some spare change or even Thought he would like a little extra whether he needed it or not. When he moves in the more perilous plane of war however the risks become infinitely greater.

Fortunately for this country, its people always seem to have a fairly clear picture of the situation. There was probably not a candidate for Congress on either ticket in the retain election: who did not declare himself for the vigorous presecution of this war to ultimate and complete victory. That came first in every candidacy. There was no divided opinion on the main issue,

If Mr. Roossvelt has one small part of the political sagacity he is credited with, he will read into the election asgacity he is credited with, he will read into the election returns another sort of "mandate;" a mandate in reverne, as it were. The people want him to go ahead vigorously with the persequition of the war; doing the things courage-ously that obviously have to be done, yielding to no prea-sure groups, however important politically they may loom. Until he pursues this course he can never astisfy the people of his capacity for leadership into the field of total war which he, as well as all others, know is the key to the only kind of victory that will be acceptable to this country.

If Mr. Roosevelt is dreaming of being a Fourth Term
President, the decision on which will be made less than
two years hence, he had better shake himself out of it
quickly, unless he is willing to place in cold storage for the
duration every one of his socialted actial betterment
schemes which is in any way infinical to winning this war.
Their revival with the return of peace may be in order,
but if they threaten in the smallest degree the early and
satisfactory conclusion of the war they should be held in
abevance.

This is the finger shaken at the President by the election returns on Nov. 3 as unmistakably as if he himself had been a candidate.

The American people are entirely capable of "swap-The American people are entirely capable of "swap-ping horses in the middle of the stream" and the slogan that saved Lincoln in 1864 would probably not prove ef-fective to pull Roosevelt through in the face of another year of war losing. He can't 'take the cash and let the credit go" without heeding "the rumble of the distant drum."

#### The War Chest Obligation

A big task confronts the people of the Detroit area if they are to make good in attaining their goal in the War Chest campaign this week. This is the last day in which to complete the job on schedule.

A few days ago it was disclosed that the sum actually raised for similar purposes in the last war in a like ampaign was 50% more than the total amount asked this year, nearly a quarter century later. Surely Detroit is a richer community now than it was then, although it still suffers from some of the scaps incurred in the great decade of depression. The payrolis of this region are enormous, the latent wealth here that can be tranmuted into cold cash is very great.

It would be a reproach to this arsenal of democracy to let it be known to the country that the community which has profited most from the war industries has fallen short of its obligations on the giving side of the war ledger.

It is not enough to say that we have worked and worked hard for the material profit we have gained out of the war. The land is covered with countless communities that are doing the same, and all equally are making the supremely greater sacrifice in the blood of their high charge the grant of the same is the same and all equally are making the supremely greater sacrifice in the blood of their
