#### Police and Firemen Request Cooperation from Residents

At times the fire and police departments of the var-ious Pointes are subjected to unfair criticism by the citizens of Grosse Pointe.

These departments WANT to give the best and fastest service possible, but are sometimes hampered in their operations by the fact that persons very often cause a serious delay in phoning in ealls or not giving complete details in their excitiement. If a fire call is made by phone, by all means give the address before you hang up. And if the call is made through a box, stay at the call box until the trucks arrive, because that is the only sure way they have of knowing exactly where the fire is.

If you cat all is nother to be where they are for a fire

If you are at all in doubt as to whether there is a fire or not, call anyway because the firemen would rather answer a false alarm than be delayed in case of fire.

To illustrate, a week or two ago, a furnace in the home of one of the Farms residents blew up, causing all the pipes and seams to split open and the house to fill with moke. Before calling the fire department, an excited maid called her employer at his downtown office and asked what she should do.

Fortunately in this case there were actually no flames but there might have been, and the time taken to make the needless call downtown could have been enough to completely destroy the house.

At the suggestion of fire Chief George Dansbury of the Farms, the News has printed the telephone numbers of all the police and fire departments of the township, with the idea in mind that they will be clipped out and kept near the telephone in case of an emergency.

#### The Only Way to Win

The American people have grown so accustomed to astronomical figures in all expressions of Government spending since the present administration came into power that they are showing diminishing interest in all govern-mental reports on the progress of our war industry that are expressed in mere terms of dollar spending. They are more concerned with what we get than impressed with what we send what we spend.

The people are willing to pay any price to win this war. This is already well proved by the passage by Congress, almost without debate, of the most stupendous appropriations ever made by any nation for any purpose in all human history. And the people never batted an eye, and the expert ground listeners in Congress knew they wouldn't.

Dollar figures have grown somewhat meaningless to the average citizen who has lost his sense of proportion in the fiscal madness of this era, in judging the piling of national expenditures against national wealth.

At the turn of the century Congress debated two or three years whether we should build a lock canal across the Isthmus of Fanama at an estimated cost of \$30,000, the Isthmus of Fanama at an estimated cost of \$50,000 cook of When Nicaragua at an estimated cost of \$50,000 cook of the Congress of the cheaper canal. These were the simple days when the people insisted on getting their money's worth.

We are being constantly told that we are doing a magnificent job in gearing for war, but when the report of war production for 1942 was officially anticipated the other day we find that production fell behind the President's schedule in every category of war implements except in ship building. The average John Citizen would not be greatly disturbed if he was convinced that we had done all that could have been done; but he is not.

He recalls that only a few months ago brothers Green and Murray solemnly buried the hatchet for the duration and agreed there should be no more strikes. Since then he has seen many strikes, only, of course, these are "unauthorized" or "outlaw". Give them any apologetic name they may, they have been strikes in vital war industries just the same and in every instance undoubtedly have caused a dislocation in the production stream more significant than the mere number of days of abstinence from work.

These experiences are leaving a dark brown taste in the citizens' mouths. In the daily ups and downs of the struggle on the fighting lines, where there are no strikes, the people have become more or less mute in their opinions regarding our shortcomings on the second fighting line. This, beyond debate, is the production line in the war industry plant.

During this time of national peril any strike in any war industry is intolerable.

A sympathetic administration has erected the legal machinery for the quick adjustment of any grievance that can arise. With these arrangements already set up all can well afford to subdue their tempers and direct their course by the star of plain, old fashioned patriotism.

And, by the same or piain, old fashioned patriolism.

And, by the same argument, any employer of labor, either corporate or private, who by his arbitrary or unjust course goads the war worker into striking by way of proceed, deserves the same treatment that would be meted out to a sabotour caught in the act of dynamiting a munition plant.

If the manpower commission just named has the forthright courage to arise to its responsibilities and opportunities it can perform one of the greatest services ever rendered to list Nation. The country will watch the early acts of Mr. McNutt and his associates with an intentness such as it has not directed at any agency of government since the war began.

When he evinces a determination that no group however numerous, or corporation or individual however rich or powerful, shall interpose their selfish interests against the national safety, the country will know at last that it is on the straight highway to final and certain victory.

This is too big a war to win by part measures. The national motor can drive us to the goal only by hitting on every cylinder.

#### Bonds for Prosperity

An inkle came over the radio a few nights ago of what may be a flash of genius from the first outstanding wizard of production the war has developed. We must regard with respect the suggestions of a man who took only four days and fifteen hours to complete a 10,000 ton ship from keel laying to launching and another 48 hours to put her in commission ready for her destined work.

Henry Kaiser the ship builder proposes to appeal to the people to buy war bonds not only from patriotic mo-tives, which fortunately appeals to millions, but as a direct means to the early possession of the things which these millions and all the other millions want.

These bonds he proposes shall be accepted as down payments, as soon as they are purchased, for such things as automobiles, refrigerators, homes built and complete be at detail, all or any to be delivered in quick order after the conclusion of the war.

We have been hearing much about these bonds as a backlog against the adversity so many economists figure must inevitably follow the war. This idea deals in concrete terms however which everybody can understand and millions might welcome.

The man who measures shipbuilding time in hours rather than months may have something here. Maybe his scheme might beat old man depression to the punch and knock him out before he gets going.

Instead of nursing our well saved bonds for applica-ling in some indefinable way against the hard times threatened they might be used to start the wheele of pro-duction whiteling squain before they had time to slow down was the high speed yeared under war, production.


