The Message

The people of this country will approve, ninety per cent plus, of all that the President said in his report to the Congress on the state of the Union.

He cautiously and properly refrained from making any positive predictions when the war would end. He so saved himself from possible future embarrassmens of the like which must by this time be a nightmare for Herr littler in his efforts to keep the German people knit together for war efforts which must appear to them now as eventually hopeless despite all the boumbast he and his propaganda steoge Geobbels can put forth.

The President has a gift for using language that the plain people understand and like. "The Naxis and Fascists have asked for it—and they are going tog est it" is the succinct way in which he voices the feelings of the average man as to what we should do in this war.

There is a complete accord with his insistence that the first task that confronts us its tow in the war. They will like the emphasis he places on this.

They are unanimous in their agreement with him that work must be had for every returning soldier when the war is over; that the distress and dislocation which followed the inst war shall be prevented and that the post war America shall be a better place for the common man. In this connection the President dropped one brief remark, easily overlooked by the casual reader, which might have greater significance for the future America han any other paragraph in his whole message.
