Official estimates by the U. S. Census Bureau indicate that Metropolitan Detroit has had a greater gain in population since April 1, 1940 than any other place in the United States. Figured at a 385,000 increase in the first 25 months of this period, it must be by now well over 300,000. Sation This great influx means the hasty physical impression of the protection of the metal protection of the orderly and confortable home life. If to this confusion in family life is added the entry of tens of thousands of men and women into war industry, often taking both husband and wife away from the home for many hours each day, the threatened wholesale breakdown in the domestic life of war industry communities is partly visualized.



SPAING WEATHER brings out kites, of course. It's fun to fly them—but be sure to see that it's done sejety! When the youngsters go out with kites, see that these safety rules are observed for the chil-dren's sake.

Fly kites only in the open fields, entirely away from any electric line. This is safer for the kite, too; it en't get tangled with wires and lost or broken.

string containing metal (such as Christmas tinsel ord) should not be used. If it should come in contact with an electric line, serious injury might sult. Even plain cotton cord conducts electricity hen wet, so don't allow kite-flying during a rain. String that has fallen into puddles should be well dried out before use. Don't use metal frames in kites.

A live wire looks like any other wire. It may not be an electric line, but another wire carrying elec-tricity can charge it by touching it some place that you cannot see. So teach children to stay clear of ny wires while flying kites.

Kite flying is fun—and it's safe, when you're careful.


