In a great war like the present, where the costs mount to such unprecedented proportions, both are necessary. Any other method leads to inflation and the certain destruction of the whole economic fabric of the Nation.

The purchase of these bonds is not a matter of choice in which the people may follow their inclinations, pro or con. It is a matter of vital necessity.

To attempt to raise the money necessary to carry on the war by taxation would absorb the entire national income, leaving nothing with which to support the civil life of the country. This struggle is too great to be maintained on any pay as you go plan.


