Sweden, which has always inclined more toward the German side than to that of the Allied countries, has recognized the Norwegian Government in Exile in London, a move she would not have dared to make prior to the disastrous Russian and North African campaigns.

Sweden's move can be definitely credited to expediency. In the last war her sympathics were notoriously German. She had close dynastic ties with the German rolling house as well-at the contract of the complete domination of Europe by the Germans.


