



It's no fun sitting in the dark simply because a blown fuse has plunged your house into a black out Most fuse trouble can be stopped before it happens by observing a few simple precautions

(1) Frayed lamp cords and extension cords are often responsible for short circuits. Such fraved cords are rous. Have them repaired BEFORE they car trouble (Don't loop cords over a nail. Don't kink cords or the them in knots. Don't run cord through a door jamb or under "ugs") (2) Never put an electric appliance in water Never poke at the element of your electric toaster (or any other appliance) with a fork or sharp tool, whether turned on or oil. (3) Don't connect too many appliances and extra lamps on one circuit. (4) Be careful not to overload your washer or feed too many pieces of clothing through the wringer at one time Tho same is true ur ironer (5) Disconnect appliances by pulling on the plug-never lerk out the cord Do not let cords come in contact with water grease or acids.



The one issue in this present stringgle on which the people of the two great English speaking democracies are united is that definite and complete provision must be made at its end to that no swash buckling would be world conqueror or war minded people shall be able to start another.

If we are able to give the world the great boon of Free dom from Fear of attack it is about all that the rest of the world of small or ewak nations should ask Some of them may not grea ly care about the other freedoms. That should be entirely up to them it is certainly not our concern to force anothing upon them that affects only their own internal arrangements.

Only one way exists to assure against another world war and that is to see to it that war minded peoples are prevented from getting ready for another one.

This points automatically to Germany There can be no satisfing assurance of future peace until and unless that country is prevented from making any form of weapons which obviously could or might be used for the purpose of warner war.

This suggests no restrictions on Germany's going as far
as she may along every path of peaceful development but it
does inply that Britan and America and Russia if she
agre s's shall maintain constant and authoritative supervision
over what goes on in Germany Not a gun of any description
to be made no poison gas no airplanes readily adapted to
war purposes no submarines.

In this way and in no other can the world be assured of peace for a long time in the future Without it we will have another war as soon as the Master Race can lick its wounds and make ready for another assault on civilization

Disarmament can be effected if we have sense enough not to complicate the task with a lot of chimerical social and economic fol de rol utterly impossible of translation into reality

Wrath to Come

With so much of this war remaining to be fought it seems nature to speculate as yet on any phases of its final days prediction however may be made now with reasonable and of fulfillment

When Germany is once convinced that she cannot win v ll sue for terms and although undoubtedly maneuver for the best she can obtain will quit even to the point unconditional surrender

The traditional German policy of ending a war before enemy troops have crossed her borders operates with peculiar effe t ins time as she must stand in mortal dread of the vrath to come if units of Holland Dutch Belgians French orwegia is Czechi Greeks Poles and Russians once set foot on her soil

Tousands of these will earry with them into German, an implacable hatred of a people who have murdered them aged parents sent their wives sisters and daughters into sol der brothels and deliberately starved their children
