

While President Roosevelt and Prime Minister Churchill at Quebec have been making far reaching and presumably determinate decisions on the conduct of the war the head of the country which has done most of the fighting and endured at least 80 fithe humn losses on the Allied side declares his dissatisfaction with the part we have played.

Queer Sales Psychology

The idea that the war tide has definitely set in in our favor and that from now on it is going to be more or less a coasting proces to victors is an infortunate bent to public thought. This war is set so far from finished that there should be nothing but sober and solemn the ht in viewing the road we have still to travel.

The plain fact is that Germany has not yet lost an acre of ground on the continent of Europe which she overran and has held since the first year

Japan in the Far East has taken over an empire in less than two vears and still holds it with the exception of a few islands on the outer fringe of her newly-conquered territors which we have wrested from her at no small expense of blood and material

We have placed too much emphasis on the North African campaign and the Sicilian expedition. In the first we had the co-operation of the French and in the second the Italians were more interested in a quick surrender than in fighting. In both of these places whenever we ran into the Germans even though we greatly outnumbered them we always knew we had had a fight.

Meanwhile Messrs Roosevelt and Churchill according to the latest reports from Quebec have put more teeth into their Unconditional Surrender slogan by openly discussing the partition of Germany

To the small frv on the sidelines it would look like a poor buld up for a stre unous appeal for \$16 000 000 000 more next month when every argument of desperate national necessity will be bally hoosed from ocean to ocean

Along with this argument that the war is going fine comes the announcement that arrangements are under way to release more war materials such as steel and rubber for civilian consumption


