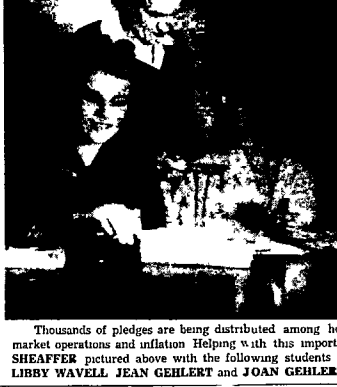

Games Tally for Blue Devils After McPhail's Interception Had Set Stage; Pass for Extra Point Fails to Click

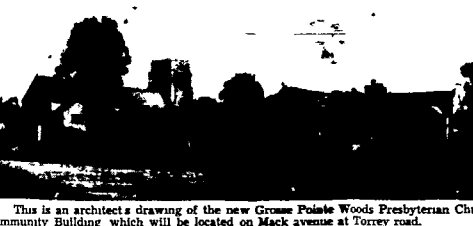

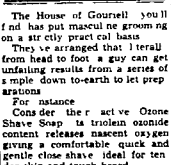
