Present Line on Fisher Road May Be Shifted Conference is Hoped

Farms' Rubbish Ordinance Passed

The garbage and rubbish ordinance which the farms village has in process of preparation for some weeks was finally adopted at the Council meeting Monday night.

Trustee Schlaepfer who had been named by President Waterson to prepare the ordinance brought several changes in the original draft growing out of the discussion of the measure at the previous meeting. These met with the approval of all the Trustees and the measure was unanimously adopted.

The ordinance provides in detail for the methods of collecting the refuse and the duties of the householders who may and may not be deported a garbage receptacle and the regulation for hauling it through the streets.

The ordinance in full is a lengthy measure but a clear digest of its provisions is published on another page of this issue by the Village authorities for the information of the householders.

Bad Weather Causes Fires

Warned to Be Careful of Flue Blazes, Start in Points

Bad weather of recent days has caused many household fires in the draft in their heat pipes and in several instances caused flue fires.

These flue fires burn themselves out without commencing the flames to the surrounding structure but if the flue lining has become broken the flames often penetrate to the woods outside. These fires are especially dangerous where the house has a wood shingle roof.

Flues become rapidly clogged with soot where wood fuel is used even occasionally, and an extremely hot fire will set off the inflammable waste a cause it to roar out of the chimney like a blast furnace.

There have been several fires of this character in the Pointe in the last 10 days.

8,500 Estimated Farms Population

In discussing the proposed public works that may be undertaken in the Farms Village after the war, Engineer Smith said in answer to a query from President Watkins that he estimated the present population of the Farms Village at 8,500.

The village has had a rapid growth having practically tripled its population since the municipal building was erected on Kerby road.

He estimated that only about one half of the vacant property available for homes had been built upon in the Farms and that with the utilization of these sites which might come rapidly in a big post war building era the population would reach about 15,000. This would be on the basis of the average land area per family seat remaining approximately as at present.

It was on this estimated population that his figures on post war development of municipal property and public services had been predicted.

Two Narrowly Escape Death By Fire in Home in Gratiot

Boys' Attempts to Get More Heat in House Nearly Cost Him and His Grandmother Their Lives Herbert Herman is Rescuer of Pair

A fire in the home of Herbert Bennett, 19446 Roscommon Gratiot township came within an eyelash of snuffing out two lives shortly after 9 o'clock Wednesday morning.

Mr. Bennett and his wife both work in a neighboring war plant, and had been away from the house for an hour or more when growing cold young Tommy Bennett went down into the cellar to see what he could do about getting more heat. He and his grandmother, Mr. Bennett's mother, a woman 71 years old, were the only occupants of the house at the time.

Young Bennett took a basket of wastepaper and proceeded to throw it generously on the fire in the furnace room at about the same time turning on the gas.

The fire was some of the burning paper that had been in the furnace and set fire to the basket of paper in the furnace room.

All that known of the matter is that a neighbor heard the fire when he was at 18350 Roscommon, a young man named Herbert Herman, who lives in the neighborhood, saw the fire and ran to the house. He found the boys and grandmother in the cellar. He tried to get them out but they were too weak to move. He called the fire department and they arrived in about 15 minutes. The boys and grandmother were rescued and taken to the hospital. The fire was extinguished and the house was damaged.

Large Mansion Being Sought By Juvenile Detention Home

Carl Schwiebert, Supervisor of Grosse Pointe township who is also the chairman of the Juvenile Detention Home committee of the County Board of Supervisors is looking for some kind of a gentleman with a family mansion on his hands that he doesn't need who will donate it to the Child Study Clinic of the Juvenile Detention Home. Before a whole group of such establishments are offered by Grosse Pointe citizens one condition must be met: the building must be near the Juvenile Detention Home at E Forest and Beaubien. It is necessary for the Child Study Clinic to be located as near as possible to the Juvenile Home as many of the cases with which the Clinic deals come to it directly from the Home and it is necessary that it be convenient to the services rendered there. Since the big increase in child delinquency the Juvenile Home

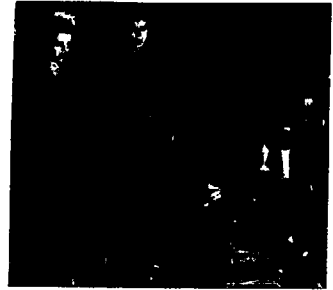
