## Reinstatement of Employees at War Studied in Farms

The relationship of the Farms Village and its policemen and firemen who leave to enter armed services during the war has been the subject of much discussion and sometimes conflicting action, has been clarified at last by reports of the Fire and Police, and Finance committees acted upon by the council meeting Thursday night.

Previous action with regard to former policemen and firemen who have entered a armed forces was repealed and the final action which covers their cases and all subsequent absence of absence was adopted which provides as follows:

All regular members of the Fire and Police Force drafted or enlisted or called into the armed forces will be reinstated in their jobs subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. That they be honorably discharged from the Armed Forces.

2. That they be physically and mentally still qualified to perform the duties of such a position.

3. That application be made within forty days after the applicant's discharge.

4. That the then council approve and reconstitute.

Be it further resolved that upon reinstatement the applicant shall be considered to have had a leave of absence without pay for all purposes.

It is further recommended that the functioning of any plan be included in the report of the Fire and Police Chiefs and spread on the minutes of the Council for future guidance.

The Council named Dr. James G. Harvey as village veterinarian to enforce it and established his rates of compensation. If he is called on to set a heart to a homeless dog, the village will pay him at the boarding rate of \$10.00 per day unless for some reason the period of confinement runs over 72 hours, in which case the rate goes up to \$12.00 per day. 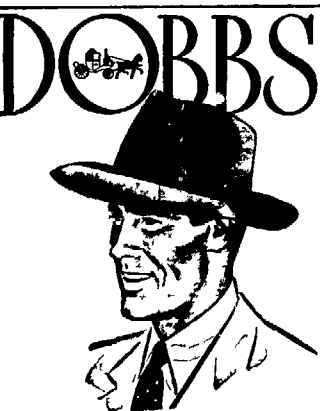

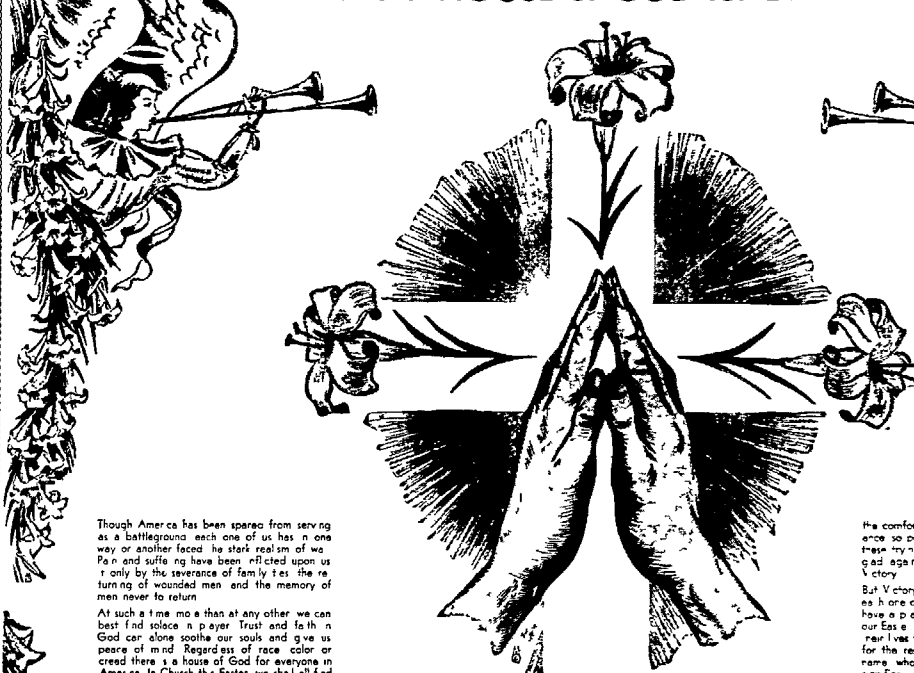

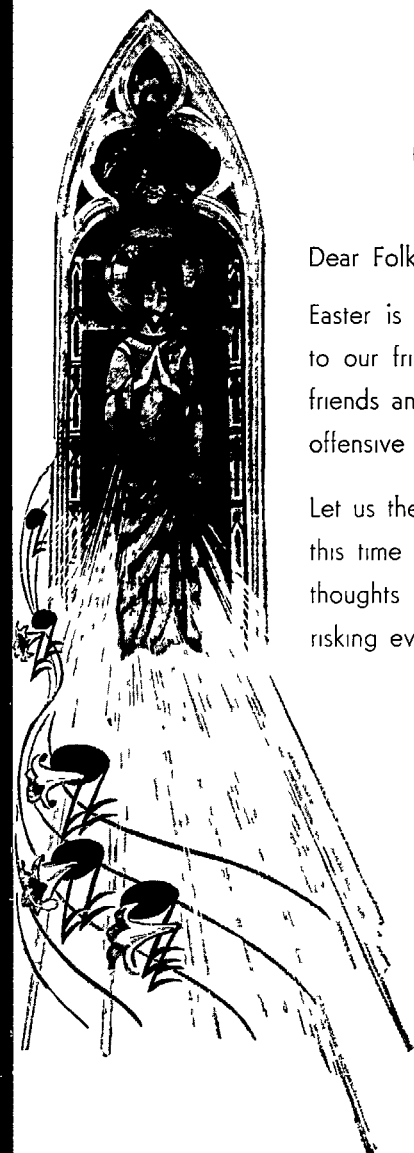
