**Park Willing To Waive Law For War Only**

**Ordinance Cast Aside, But Only to Permit War Industry to Function**

At the Park village commissioners meeting Monday night Village Attorney Fred McGraw called attention to the action the Commission had recently made waiving the operation of zoning law temporarily in favor of Reed Brothers machine shop on Charlevoix and Lakeshore under which they were to be permitted to open a war production manufacturing business with more than five employees to the completion of the contract with the government. The ordinance was not to be after the ending of the war.

This property had been taken over by the state for the non-payment of taxes and subsequent to the state's taking over the state to the Secor title insurance corporation and by this latter concern in turn sold under a contract to the Reed Brothers concern.

The question which Mr. McGraw posed was the possibility that if there should be defaults in the carrying out of the contract by the state, the village would be left with the original restrictions of the zoning law. In that event it would be a case of the village as a new owner who would then be forced to sue the state for such a case as he wished to sue directly within the area with which manufacturer was prohibited.

Mr. McGraw did not believe that such a suit would be a top but thought it wise to pre-empt the possibility of the case as they appeared.

The Commissioners commend the action and passed a resolution that the Village attorney should stipulate in the agreement between the Village and the Reed Brothers concern the clear stipulation that the contract with it applied only to them and did not involve with any subsequent owners.

The village desired to amend its zoning regulations in answer to the demand for war production but was strongly opposed to committing itself to any contract which might later invalidate its strict zoning regulations against manufacturing concerns within residential areas.

**Pointe Contributes 100 Tons Weekly to Salvage**

The collection of waste paper, glass, metals and all forms of salvageable materials for war work is proceeding at a lively rate at the Grosse Pointe City's reduction plant at Radnor and Warren.

# Birds Have Tough Winter



FEED THE BIRDS

The kind of winter we are having in the mid west this year, with the ground being covered with several inches of snow and more falling each week is one which calls for concern for our little feathered friends the birds. Some sympathy and regard for them on our part in the form of food and shelter in stormy winter weather will make them comfortable and even save many of their lives. In some instances forty-eight hours of no food means tragedy to the bird world and since the sources of ground food are covered by snow putting food out for them is very important.

Most birds are especially fond of chick feed and crumbs from the table. Sunflower seed is especially attractive to the cardinals and peanuts to the blue jay. A little suet placed in a wire mesh and hung on the side of a tree trunk will attract chickadees, woodpeckers and nuthatches. Because of the presence of rats food should not generally be scattered on the ground but rather placed in trays. Birds do not appreciate fancy trays and so something very simple will do.

Feeding the birds is not only of economic value but is a rich aesthetic experience as what is more beautiful than our redbirds which stay with us all winter.

## Notice to Residents

# Re: GARBAGE

Section 7c Village Ordinance No. 38 reads as follows:

- The word Garbage shall be deemed to include every refuse or accumulation of animal or vegetable matter that is or may be a nuisance or an annoyance to the community or to the health, safety or morals of the neighborhood, including dead animals and condemned foods found within the Village limits.
- The word refuse shall be deemed to include ashes, rubbish, paper, rags, bottles, tin cans, glass, denatured alcohol, kerosene, and all other similar or like material which may be accumulated on the premises to be disposed.
- A garbage shall be placed in a separate watertight metal or concrete container. Garbage placed in such containers shall be drained so as to prevent freezing or the accumulation of destructive or noxious acids. No tin cans, glass or other rubbish shall be placed in the garbage container. No liquid waste shall be placed in a garbage container. All garbage containers shall be cleaned at least once a month.
- Ashes shall be placed in a separate metal or noncombustible container.
- Rubbish, paper, rags, bottles, tin cans and similar or like material and substances shall be placed in separate containers which may consist of either wood or metal or burlap or canvas bags.

The contract in charge of garbage collection has recently entered a contract that glass cans and paper are now being deposited in some of the garbage cans.

The Village at the present time is not in a position to collect and dispose of noxious and rubbish and are asking your cooperation in handling noxious garbage in accordance with the ordinance.

The Commission finds it necessary to warn those who deposit glass, paper, etc. in garbage containers that they will be required to appear in Justice Court charged with violation of a Village Ordinance.
