Retirement Pension Plan Is Explained To Farms Residents

Many Prominent Citizens and Taxpayers Attend Special Meeting in Village to Hear Gabriel Clarify Proposed Move

A goodly number of the most prominent citizens and heaviest taxpayers in the Farms Village availed themselves Friday night of the invitation extended by President Watkins and the Board of Trustees to hear the proposed Retirement Pension plan for the Village employees explained by A. G. Gabriel, the actuarial expert who worked out the mathematics of the plan at the request of the Village Board.

On retirement many different options are presented similar in general aspects to the options available to the holder of a maturing life insurance policy. The amount of retirement pay varies with the term of his employment by the village and his earnings while employed.

An employee who retires before the age of 55 will draw nothing from the fund except what he has paid in, with interest. After 55 and prior to retirement at sixty he is entitled to certain equities in the sum paid in by the village.

The amounts paid into the fund annually from both sources, based on a payroll of \$120,000 per year, and the amount of the pension which the figures were determined would amount to \$100,000 for the village. The fund is designed to care only for the employees of the village who are not members of the police or fire departments, as these groups already have a retirement fund especially created for them by the village some years ago. It is estimated that village made a contribution of \$50,000 in five equal annual installments of \$10,000 each.

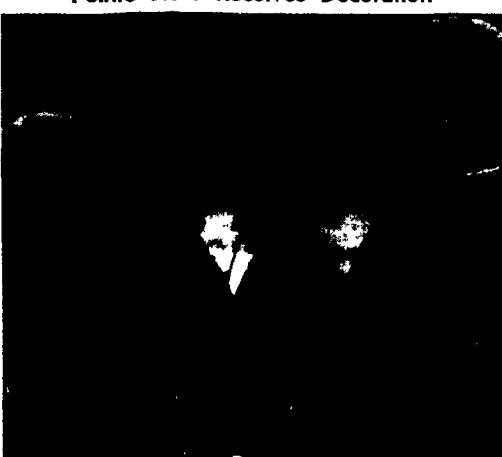
It is provided however that if an employee retires before that an employee who has been a member of the police or fire departments should after a term of years decide to leave the fire or police department and take employment with the village in a capacity which lay within the scope of the employee's retirement fund, he will receive credit on his retirement at the age of sixty for all years he has been in the police or fire departments. His payments on retirement would be less. It is estimated that the amount of his own contribution to the fund would be \$2,000.

Paul and Future Service
The money which the village pays into the fund takes into account both the past and future service of the employee.

The village payments are made directly from public funds each year and are divorced entirely from any estimated receipts from investments.

The attention of the reader is called to the complete explanation of the fund and its workings.

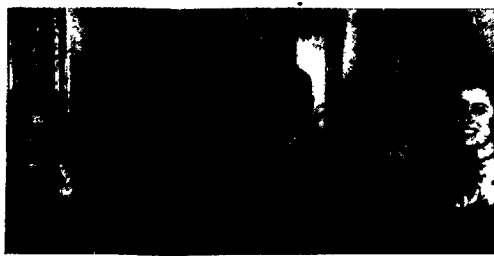
