Thieves Who Robbed Pointe Gas Station are Captured

Hardened Young Pair Picked Up By Detroit Police Confess Burglarring Korte Place Last February 24

Two young hardened criminals picked up on March 14, have confessed to the robbery of the Korte gas station on Kercheval avenue on February 24.

The thieves Cecil M. Jones, 21 of 1710 18th Street, Detroit, and Mack Dixon, 20 of 3533 Vinewood street, Detroit, were picked up by Detroit police.

The pair have been watched by Lincoln Park police for some months. They robbed 20 service stations there and stole 41 tires. They will be tried first in that city.

The youths said it was their first visit to the Pointe. They safe they took from the Korte place was opened in a garage in the rear of a house on Scoville avenue and later abandoned in an alley. Dixon had deposited some \$90 in checks found in the safe to his account in the National Bank of Detroit. They used stolen gas coupons to make a trip to Muskegon to get rid of some of the tires.

A set of stolen tools has been returned to Korte. They had been sold to a used parts dealer. Jones is alleged to have served a term in Leavenworth for desertion and Dixon is said to have a discharge from the Army. Clothing stolen from the clean-up gang is 11 absent which occupy part of the Korte station, was abandoned at Kercheval near Proctor when the youths found it did not fit them.

It is used only for ingress to the private properties fronting on it. The situation is somewhat similar to that which has plagued the property owners on the lake end of Bishop road for some time.

It was informally agreed between the private parties and the commissioners that they might erect a 'No throughfare' sign at the entrance and a 'No Trespassing' sign at the lake end and the village would assure sufficient police protection to enforce the observance.
