This mutual guarantee of protection on the continent for 122 years of growth and change in the Monroe Doctrine the keystone of American foreign policy. Today as a result of the splendid accomplishments of the Inter American Conference at Mexico City—a better and stronger Pan American Union has been achieved.

to this population of Spain and her colonies some 27 millions and you have a grand total of 115 millions in the Spanish speaking world. As a matter of fact Spanish today has become the most important language in the world. Spanish is one modern language of our youth should learn. In this air age and globe spanned world the knowledge of one or two foreign languages has become a necessity. Obviously of the immense area of Latin America its enormous distances and profound differences in language customs laws and traditions it is difficult for persons in this country to know the situation with local conditions in each of the 20 individual Latin American nations whose total population just now is about the same as that of the United States some 125 millions.

As a consequence there is an unfortunate tendency to consider Latin America as one big market instead of so many countries and separate markets each with varied natural resources as well as different climates, populations and characteristics. We must therefore remember that every one of these 20 independent nations is highly individual and quite different from any of its neighbors. Moreover, we must not allow mere differences of language and customs between the North and South American continents to interfere with closer and better cultural social and business relations with our friendly neighbors south of the Rio Grande if we are all to live in peace and are privileged to live in the Treaty of North Central and South America can learn so much from their mutual friendship and respect not only among ourselves as individuals but also between governments of independent sister republics.

Patrolism is a great moving force in this country today. But we must not confuse patriotism with blind nationalism. As President Roosevelt said the good neighbor respects himself and because he does so he respects the rights of others. We should be mindful of the fact that Latin Americans are just as patriotic as we are just as proud of their country and history just as hopeful of the future. We must be inclined to set up our standards of life as the ONLY way of life. We must learn that there are people in this world who do not want to change the mode of life. The think their own civilization and culture are pretty good too. Love and let live might therefore be an excellent policy to adopt when dealing with Latin America. What right have we to think that our own North American civilization is the best? The time is now ripe for laying the solid foundation of trade and friendship between the 260 million people who live between Labrador in the north and Panama in the south. We are on the very threshold of an amazing expansion in our foreign trade which will far surpass any gain seen in the past. Enlarged freedom of trade between all nations of this Hemisphere has now become an economic necessity.

# Give Posthumous Decoration To 1st Lieut. David Loughlin

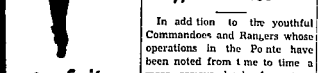

# Governor's Committee Lauds Pointe Youth Guidance Work

1944 Report Gives Factual and Favorable Picture of Activities Carried on For Local Children

The 1944 Report of the Governor's Youth Guidance Committee of Wayne County has given a factual and yet favorable picture of youth guidance activities in Grosse Pointe according to Dr. Paul L. Essert, Superintendent of Schools.

The Wayne County Committee is one of many committees set up by the State of Michigan to study and improve youth guidance in war time. Dr. Essert pointed out that the committee has issued a Progress Report to the Governor which shows that the five Grosse Pointe municipalities and the Grosse Pointe School District are alert to the problem of Michigan and the community has no alarming war time problem in juvenile delinquency. The Grosse Pointe people can be proud of their efforts that this report summarizes.

The following is taken from the text of the report:

The summer camps have expanded to some degree. The Pointe Club continues to sponsor dances and parties regularly. The Junior Red Cross carries on a very active program and has been enlarged. The schools carry on the usual dances, sports, all sorts of amusements in the auditoriums and gymnasiums as well as carrying on all phases of the war effort.

The area has satisfactory community centers. Youth groups are assisting and participating in recreational planning.

An example of this is the community Halloween celebration planned by youth and adult committees.

The Parent Teacher Association is set very engaged in the welfare of the child. A very effective program of activities for young people and a code for parents have been developed through the cooperation of the faculty, parents and youth. The thinking of the group has been centered in the program of teenage youth. This program is being carried on in the community.

A series of programs has been arranged by the Parent Teacher Association for large and small mixed groups on the problems of school and community.

An outstanding series of lectures is sponsored by the Grosse Pointe Lectures Incorporated. The Community Lectures Series is an act sponsored by the Ad. H. Education Department of the Board of Directors composed of representatives of all organized community groups.

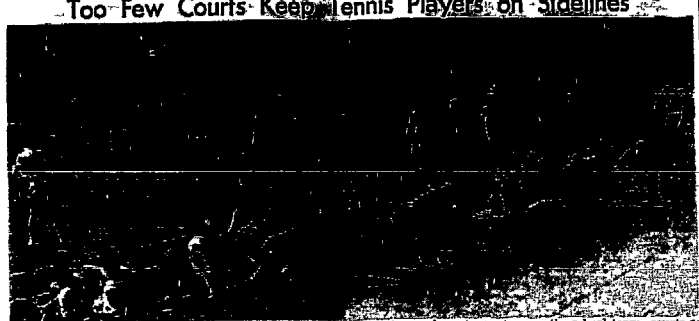
