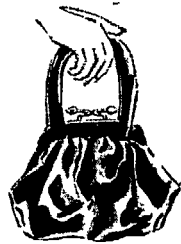

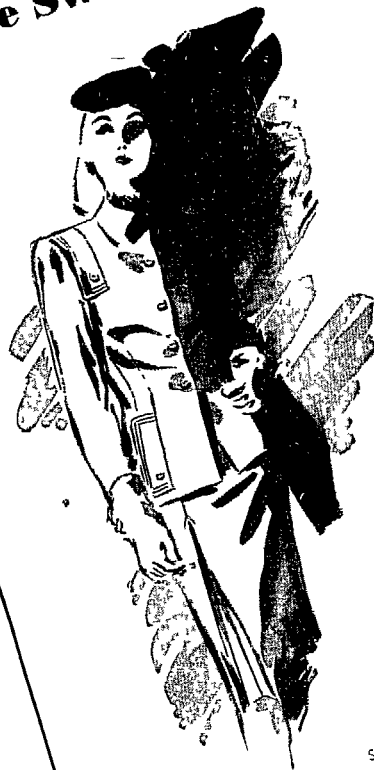

Gallantry of Richard Pioch Wins Posthumous Decoration

Private First Class Richard C. Pioch has been awarded the Silver Star posthumously for gallantry in action on the Fifth Army front in northern Italy.

Pioch was a member of Company F, 21st Infantry Regiment of the 1st "Powder River" Division.

When the advance of his platoon was temporarily halted by intense enemy fire Pioch left his place of safety to aid in neutralizing the fire. He dragged his light machine gun to an exposed position from which he could deliver accurate fire.

Although under full observation of the enemy, he continued to deliver an accurate and relentless stream of fire at the attackers until they were forced to withdraw.

Refusing to leave the dangerous position, he continued to fire for several hours until he was mortally wounded. His actions prevented a serious breakthrough and gave his company sufficient time to organize for an attack.

His outstanding courage, determination in the face of the enemy and heroic self sacrifice are in keeping with the highest traditions of the Infantry and the United States Army the citation read.
