Village Engineers Say Job Will Be Completed by September Unless Government Directives Cause More Delay

Edward Pace of the firm of Pale and Hinn, consulting engineers for the Woods village, who has been in charge of the big sewer and storm water control project for the village says the project is going into the home stretch. The buildings and foundation work for both the Master runs and Torrey Woods pumping stations are all finished and the pumps and motors and electrical control apparatus is practically all on the ground and will be in place and ready for operation in a few weeks.

The Torrey Woods pumping station has been delayed in getting its pumps motors and control apparatus through no fault that could be provided against. The Worthington Pump Company which is making the machinery for this station has been interrupted on several occasions by the receipt of directives from the Navy Department which necessitated setting aside the Woods village apparatus to make way for Navy priorities.

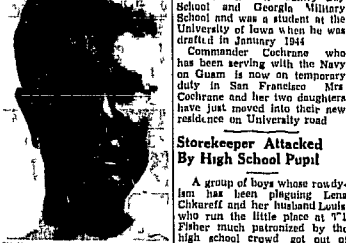

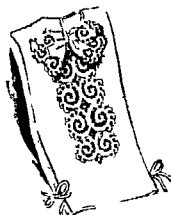

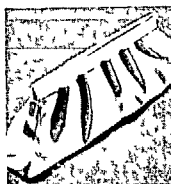

Christ Church Marks 100th Anniversary

Four Special Events at Beloved Old Landmark Celebrating Birthday

Christ Church parish will be 100 years old on May 26. Beginning today Thursday, May 3, the clergy and parishioners will celebrate the hundredth anniversary with four special events at the Parish Church the beloved old landmark standing on East Jefferson Avenue between Hastings and Howard.

It was on May 26 1845 - Ascension Day - that 67 people met together and petitioned the Bishop for the forming of the Christ Church Detroit. Three days later in the Sunday School of old St. Paul's a Vestry was elected, and shortly afterward was presented plans for the erection of the original church. Church and land were to cost \$4,000.

Cornerstone Laid
 It was not until July 16 1861 that the cornerstone of the present Christ Church on East Jefferson was laid. Today Christ Church Parish, with its three churches and three parishes numbers 230 communicants.

Opening event in the celebration of the centenary will take place at 8 p. m. tonight with a Choral Evensong. The Most Reverend Henry St. George Tucker D. D., Primate of the American Church will officiate, the sermon the Clergy of the Diocese are invited to join in the Procession.

On Thursday May 10 which is Ascension Day the Reverend Robert S. Whithead Vicar will celebrate Holy Communion at 11 a. m. and a 2 o'clock that evening will come a concert on an interesting Ladyday Men at Hall. Fourth and final special event will be the Anniversary Service at 11 a. m. on Sunday May 13. The Reverend Francis B. Creamer Rector, will give us a sermon.
