Instruction Is Reorganized In All Pointe Public Schools

Elementary Physical Education, Art and Music to Be Strengthened and Counseling Will Be Improved

According to a recent announcement by Dr. Paul L. Bennett, Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education has approved plans resulting from a two year study to reorganize the present program of physical education and music in the elementary grades and to improve the education of children in all grades from kindergarten through grade 12 more efficiently by instituting in the teaching staff a group of teachers who will give part of their time to individual counseling of pupils.

The two steps are in the direction of meeting non academic needs of Grosse Pointe children that are not regularly or thoroughly met in the academic classroom.

The Grosse Pointe Schools said the Superintendent said the Board of Education has approved plans for the high quality work done in the elementary and middle spelling history and in the various specializations of junior and senior high school classrooms.

Requests Answered

"While we are constantly striving to improve our work in these fields the Superintendent is desirous to give recognition to the repeated requests of parents and pupils for preparing pupils to develop abilities and capacities in health in art and music and to find time to devote to them and to plan to meet many personal problems which are not dealt with in ordinary daily instruction."

The program of instruction in Grosse Pointe during the past few years has sought to provide a part time technical education in music and physical education in each of the elementary schools. Methods of training of colleges and teacher preparation institutions have not always provided the training necessary for a teacher to do the double assignment of regular classroom work as well as these special fields.

War time shortages of well prepared teachers has accentuated this difficulty. The new program as announced by the Superintendent provides a skilled and highly trained specialist in each of these fields to work with teachers in the entire school system.

Music Accentuated

Glenn Woods, Supervisor of Music, will give special attention to the music teaching in the elementary schools, working with teachers who indicate a need for his services.

William Hicks who has for several years done a distinguished job in elementary physical education in the Mason School will be released to assist teachers of health education in their desire to improve their work.

A similar arrangement will be made in the field of elementary art.

These changes in the instructional program are under the central direction of the Assistant Superintendent of Schools in Charge of Instruction, John R. Barnes.

Approved by Board

After two years of careful planning and studying by all secondary teachers and principals the plan for reorganization of the secondary guidance program has been approved by the Board of Education and the following changes have been made in the staff depending upon the ability of the Superintendent to secure teacher replacements.

The guidance program for the entire school system will be centered in the Office of the Director of Pupil Personnel Mr. Lynn E. Bartlett.

All of the counselors on both the elementary and secondary

application in Michigan. As this problem deals with both land and building values each of which includes various potential factors for consideration, not only to both the Commission analyzed and considered them separately.

The 1944 appeals which were on or included land values pro- tested the high ratio of assessable values to actual value and claim ed inequity between comparable properties on certain portions of the lake frontage. Our analysis reveals this to be correct in that portion of the township where the public highway is adjacent to the lake shore thereby preventing the property owners of the full use and value of their lake frontage, approximating that portion of Lake Shore Drive from Jefferson Avenue north to a point in the Village of Grosse Pointe Shores where the area between the drive and the lake shore is sufficient for building purposes on which there are no building restrictions. The Commission recommends a reduction of ten percent on the basic front foot land value of the properties located in that area.

Attached to the communication was a schedule which showed the percentage of assessment reduction which would apply on all "mansion" type properties i.e. those of an assessed value of \$40,000 and over. These show the reduction would run from 10% on \$40,000 valuation to 30% of those of \$200,000 and over.

The letter directly intimates that if the Township Board does not see fit to make the reductions of its own volition on the state board will do so. Mr. Schweikert says the Board is far from willing to make the reduction and will probably let the State Board take the responsibility on its own shoulder. He says that while the township is interested in the fiscal implications of the proposed reduction is small it would effect a reduction in the tax rate on all property in the fiscal implications would be serious. 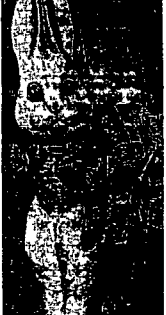

Mixed Grill Has Appeal For Everyone

A mixed grill is an ideal suggestion for Sunday dinner or for any meal that is to be rather special and yet easy to prepare. Whether served on a platter or on individual plates, a mixed grill has a great deal of appeal.

This is a grand way to make a small amount of meat look like a lot and to utilize small pieces of meat in fine style. With careful selection of foods to be combined plus artistic color arrangement and garnishing this kind of a meal can look like a 10-dollar dinner.

The different foods are cooked together in the broiler but, at the same time, allow the right amount of time for each. Broiling do not try to cook foods too fast, particularly meat. Slow broiling is accomplished by placing the broiler rack so that there will be 2 to 3 inches between the meat and the broiling element or unit. This makes the meat juicier, more delicious—and it saves watching of the food while it's cooking.

The following are just a few of the many interesting combinations which may be made:

- Lamb chops with small neck sausage and tomatoes.
- Ground lamb patties with bacon crusted potato patties, and cooked carrot strips.
